## Ordinance 17754

	Proposed No. 2014-0067.1 Sponsors Phillips	
1	AN ORDINANCE dissolving the King County	
2	transportation benefit district created under Ordinance	
3	16742; and repealing Ordinance 16742, Section 3, and	
4	K.C.C. 2.121.010, Ordinance 16742, Section 6, and K.C.C.	
5	2.121.020, Ordinance 16742, Section 5, and K.C.C.	
6	2.121.030 and Ordinance 16742, Section 4, and K.C.C.	
7	2.121.040; and declaring an emergency.	
8	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:	
9	SECTION 1. Findings:	
10	A. King County created a transportation benefit district with geographical	
11	boundaries comprised of the unincorporated limits of the County through	
12	adoption of Ordinance 16742 in 2010. The district has never imposed a vehicle	
13	fee or submitted revenue measures to the voters.	
14	B. King County is creating a new transportation benefit district to be	
15	known as the King County transportation district with geographical boundaries	
16	comprised of the limits of the county that will replace the existing transportation	
17	benefit district.	
18	C. It is in the public interest to dissolve the unincorporated area district in	
19	connection with formation of the countywide district.	

20	D. To ensure that the dissolution of the district is effective before the
21	establishment of a countywide district, it is necessary to enact this ordinance as an
22	emergency ordinance.
23	SECTION 2. The King County transportation benefit district created under
24	Ordinance 16742 is hereby dissolved.
25	SECTION 3. The following are each hereby repealed:
26	A. Ordinance 16742, Section 3, and K.C.C. 2.121.010;
27	B. Ordinance 16742, Section 6, and K.C.C. 2.121.020;
28	C. Ordinance 16742, Section 5, and K.C.C. 2.121.030; and
29	D. Ordinance 16742, Section 4, and K.C.C. 2.121.040.
30	SECTION 4. The county council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency
31	exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace,

- 32 health or safety or for the support of county government and its existing public
- 33 institutions.
