1	AN ORDINANCE ap	oproving the City of Issaquah Water
2	System Plan Update.	
3	STATEMENT OF FACTS:	
4	1. King County has adopted	K.C.C. chapter 13.24, which requires
5	approval of comprehensive p	plans for water utilities that distribute or obtain
6	water in unincorporated King	g County as a prerequisite for operating in
7	unincorporated King County	, receiving approval for annexation proposals,
8	being granted right of way fr	anchises, and being given approval for right
9	of way construction permits.	K.C.C. 13.24.060 prescribes the requirements
10	for approval of such plans, in	ncluding consistency with state and local
11	planning requirements.	
12	2. The city of Issaquah's las	t water system plan was prepared in 2002.
13	Both Washington state Depa	artment of Health and King County regulations
14	require water system plans t	o be updated every six years.
15	3. The city's service area is	within King County and the city has adopted a
16	water system plan update ("h	the plan").
17	4. King County has adopted	l a Comprehensive Plan that includes water
18	supply policies in its provisi	ons for facilities and services (policies F-101

through F-254) that call for consistency with other adopted plans, support

20	for regional water supply planning, pursuit of reclaimed water, water
21	conservation and protection of water resources.
22	5. K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires the utilities technical review committee
23	to review and make a recommendation to the King County executive and
24	council on the plan, the requirements under K.C.C. chapter 13.24 and
25	consistency with the King County Comprehensive Plan. The utilities
26	technical review committee has reviewed the planning data and city
27	operations and has found:
28	a. The plan uses population and employment forecasts developed by the
29	Puget Sound Regional Council and acknowledges the housing and job
30	growth targets adopted by the Growth Management Planning Council for
31	the city's service area;
32	b. Portions of the city's service area are in unincorporated King County;
33	c. The capital facility plan is adequate to meet anticipated facility and
34	service needs;
35	d. The plan is consistent with applicable Washington state water quality
36	laws; and
37	e. The plan is consistent with other pertinent county adopted plans and
38	policies.
39	6. The Washington state Department of Health approval is pending upon
40	King County's approval of the plan.

41	7. Under the state Environmental Policy Act the city issued a
42	Determination of Nonsignificance for the issuance of the plan on
43	December 12, 2012. There were no appeals.
44	8. The city's operations and facilities meet multiple existing statutory,
45	administrative and planning standards. As the city's operations, facilities
46	and planning meet the requirements of the King County Code, and are
47	consistent with the King County Comprehensive Plan, the utilities
48	technical review committee has recommended approval of the plan.
49	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

- 50 SECTION 1. The City of Issaquah Water System Plan Update, Attachment A to
- 51 this ordinance, is hereby approved as a water system plan.
