- Guide decisions regarding water taxi service for the next 3-5 years





# **Assessment Findings**

- Ridership is increasing with better service
- Financial performance has improved increased fairbox recovery and decreased cost/rider
- Significant near-term capital costs associated with Colman Dock
- Operating Costs Exceed Operating Revenues
- Reserve Fund is Close to Depleted


