of financing public facilities (i.e., roads,
parks and open space, schools) that become necessary as a result of new growth
and development.
King County administers the School Impact Fee Program by collecting fees from

and development.

King County administers the School Impact Fee Program by collecting fees from residential developers on behalf of each school district that chooses to participate (the program is voluntary). The fees are developed by the individual school districts in accordance with provisions in state low and the King County Code, and are set forth in the districts' capital facilities plans. The plans (and fees) are reviewed and adopted by the King County Council.
