#### KING COUNTY FERRY DISTRICT 2015 Annual Work Plan

#### Overview

Following consolidation of the King County Ferry District into King County, for 2015 King County (County) provides waterborne transit service, also known as passenger only ferry service or water taxi service, on King County waterways. The County operates two waterborne transit routes:

Vashon Island - Downtown Seattle Water Taxi providing three morning and three afternoon trips during the commute periods; and

West Seattle – Downtown Seattle Water Taxi providing seasonal (commute and non-commute) service April through October and commute service November through March.

The detail associated with the schedule of service for these routes is described at the end of this Work Plan.

In association with these waterborne transit services, shuttle connections with landside vehicle parking areas are also provided.

The County is governed by an elected Executive and County Council with their roles specified in the King County Charter. Waterborne transit services are managed and delivered through the normal course of business by the King County Department of Transportation.

#### Work Plan Goals for 2015

#### Operations and Administration:

- Continue delivering existing water taxi services using leased vessel and owned vessel until new vessels are completed;
- Provide on-water and landside operations for the two routes;
- Manage personnel including hiring, training, record keeping, discipline, payroll, scheduling and dispatch;
- Oversee vessel operations such as moorage, provision of contracted back-up vessels, schedule performance, and maintenance;
- Manage shoreside operations including transit coordination, passenger contact and facility upkeep;
- Provide public interface including customer service, lost and found and communications of real time vessel operations;
- Using the result of 2014 landside operations evaluation, refine and implement changes to enhance waterborne transit ridership;
- Contract for an assessment of passenger only ferry expansion options, consistent with
  the District's strategic plan, that builds on new transit options that are projected to be
  delivered through Sound Transit's University Link and other funded regional transit
  expansions being delivered in the next decade. This assessment should include
  assessments of facility, service options and cost estimates for both capital and
  operations, and community interest and readiness. The final report shall be transmitted
  to the Board of Supervisors or its successor by September 30, 2015. An interim report

- summarizing the work and results to date on all aspects of the assessment to the Board of Supervisors or its successor by July 31, 2015; and
- Implement a marketing and outreach program supporting a 3.3% growth ridership.

# **Capital Improvement Program**

- Using predominantly federal grant funding, continue design-build contracted construction of new vessels including contracted project management; and
- Continue planning for the replacement of Pier 50 passenger only ferry facilities in concert with Washington State Department of Transportation's Colman Dock safety and preservation project.
