The Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA) authorizes local jurisdictions to collect impact fees as a method of financing public facilities (i.e., roads, parks and open space, schools) that become necessory as a result of new growth and development. King County administers the School Impact Fee Program by collecting fees from residential developments on behalf of each school district that chooses to participate (the program is valuntary). The fees are developed by the Individual school districts in accordance with provisions in state law and the King Caunty Code, and are set forth in the districts' capital facilities plans. The plans (and fees) are reviewed and adopted by the King County Cauncil.
