1	A MOTION adopting the King County Vision, Mission,
2	Guiding Principles, Goals and Strategic Innovation
3	Priorities.
4	WHEREAS, county government must continuously improve its management and
5	accountability so residents receive maximum value for their tax dollars, and
6	WHEREAS, in 2008, Ordinance 16202 created a countywide performance and
7	accountability system to promote a culture of accountability within King County
8	government, and
9	WHEREAS, in 2010, the executive proposed and the King County council
10	adopted Ordinance 16897 approving the King County Strategic Plan, 2010-2014, which
11	established the broad policy and management framework to unify and inform decision
12	making across all branches of King County government, and
13	WHEREAS, in 2012, Ordinance 17410 established a council and executive
14	interbranch performance management action team to review and make recommendations
15	on how to better translate the broad goals and objectives of the Strategic Plan to agency
16	operational and budgeting processes, and
17	WHEREAS, in June 2014, Ordinance 17834 established a new performance
18	management and accountability system and enacted the recommendations for the

19 performance management action team through the updating and rewrite of K.C.C. chapter 20 2.10, and WHEREAS, Ordinance 17834 requires the executive to transmit legislation 21 containing the King County vision, mission, guiding principles, goals and strategic 22 innovation priorities for adoption by the King County council; 23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: 24 A. The King County Vision Statement, Mission Statement, Guiding Principles 25 and Goals and King County's Goals and Vision, 2015, Attachments A and B to this 26 27 motion, are hereby adopted. B. The council requests the executive to establish cross-functional strategic teams 28 consistent with K.C.C. chapter 2.10 for each of the goals identified in Attachment A to 29 this motion in order to identify objectives for each of the identified goals and to carry out 30 31 the work specified in K.C.C. 2.10.104. C. The council further requests the executive to collaborate with the council to 32

- develop work plans for planning/policy gap areas identified in King County's Goals and
- Vision, 2015, Attachment B to this motion.
