Description of request:

The King County Council passed motion 2015-0173 identifying the need for snow and ice facilities and sander racks. The Road Services Division is proposing an increase in the appropriation authority of the biennial budget to construct the 2 materials storage sheds and sander racks from the motion as well as at 7 additional sites throughout the service area for the storage of sand, bulk salt and anti-ice tank(s). By constructing covered materials storage sheds at strategic locations, crews can be prepositioned and have less travel time to refill trucks. This will increase miles of service delivery and reduce safety risks to the public.
