Name of Proposal: Ordinance 2015-0437

Description of Proposal: Ordinance 17287, adopted in 2012, established a master planning demonstration project for a regional motor sports facility on the Pacific Raceways property located east of Auburn.

Proposed Ordinance 2015-0437 would amend Ordinance 17287 to allow interim uses of the Pacific Raceways property prior to the application of a master planning process. The specific activities would include construction of up to 400,000 square feet of automobile racing garages, and associated excavation, grading and processing of on-site materials as necessary. These interim uses would be reviewed by the King County Department of Permitting and Environmental Review (DPER) under procedures and timelines established in Proposed Ordinance 2015-0437. DPER would make a recommendation to the King County Hearing Examiner, who would approve or deny the permit.
