2	A RESOLUTION relating to the finances of the King
3	County Flood Control Zone District, and making a
4	declaration of substantial need for the purpose of
5	setting the limit factor for the District's 2016 tax levy.
6	WHEREAS, RCW 84.55.010 provides that a taxing jurisdiction may levy taxes in
7	an amount no more than the limit factor multiplied by the highest levy of the most recent
8	three years, plus additional amounts resulting from new construction and improvements
9	to property, newly constructed wind turbine, solar, biomass and geothermal facilities, and
10	any increase in the value of state-assessed property; and
11	WHEREAS, under RCW 84.55.005(2)(c), the limit factor for a taxing district
12	with a population of 10,000 or more shall be the lesser of 101 percent or 100 percent plus
13	inflation; and
14	WHEREAS, RCW 84.55.005(1) defines "inflation" as the percentage change in
15	the implicit price deflator for personal consumption expenditures for the United States as
16	published for the most recent twelve-month period by the Bureau of Economic Analysis
17	of the federal Department of Commerce by September 25 of the year before the taxes are
18	payable; and

19	WHEREAS, inflation for September, 2015 is 0.251 percent and the limit factor is
20	0.251 percent, which means that the King County Flood Control Zone District's
21	("District") 2016 tax levy will decrease, except for the amounts resulting from new
22	construction and improvements to property, newly constructed wind turbine, solar,
23	biomass and geothermal facilities, and any increase in the value of state-assessed
24	property; and
25	WHEREAS, RCW 84.55.0101 provides for use of a limit factor of 101 percent or
26	less upon a finding of substantial need made by a majority plus one of the legislative
27	authority of the taxing district; and
28	WHEREAS, every year, King County faces threats from flooding, the impacts of
29	which are far-reaching and pose significant threats to public health and safety and
30	economic activities throughout the county; and
31	WHEREAS, the one hundred-year floodplain in the county covers more than
32	25,000 acres or almost forty square miles; and
33	WHEREAS, more than five hundred flood protection facilities through the county
34	protect property with an estimated assessed value of more than \$7,000,000,000; and
35	WHEREAS, flood control facilities provide vital protection to the regional
36	economy; and
37	WHEREAS, one of the most fundamental functions of government is to protect
38	citizens and public and private property from the ravages of natural disasters such as
39	flooding; and
40	WHEREAS, due to the significant cost of flood protection facilities, as provided
41	for in the District's comprehensive plan, and the long-term adverse impact of using a

- limit factor of less than 101 percent, the District board of supervisors finds that there is a
- substantial need to set the limit factor for the District's 2016 tax levy at 101 percent; now,
