1	AN ORDINANCE relating to county property tax levies for		
2	collection in 2016; implementing RCW 84.55.0101, finding		
3	substantial need and providing for a limit factor of one		
4	hundred and one percent in accordance with RCW		
5	84.55.0101.		
6	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:		
7	SECTION 1. Findings:		
8	A. RCW 84.55.0101 allows the county council to set limit factors for regular		
9	property tax levies to a maximum of one hundred one percent upon a finding of		
10	substantial need.		
11	B. King County provides criminal justice, transit, elections, assessments, natural		
12	resources and parks, public health and human services to two million residents. The		
13	demand for these services provided by King County continues to grow - fueled by an		
14	expanding population. To ensure King County maintains its commitments to adequate		
15	levels of basic services for a growing population, it must provide for the cost of those		
16	services. Setting the limit factor for regular property tax levies to the maximum of one		
17	hundred and one percent allows King County to strive to meet service demands at a local		
18	level.		

19	C. The total adopted King County budget for the 2015/2016 biennium is \$8.9		
20	billion, and the total adopted general fund budget for the 2015/2016 biennium is \$1.5		
21	billion.		
22	D. The general fund and other funds are continuing to experience a fiscal		
23	shortfall that is the result of revenue growth that is not keeping pace with the increasing		
24	costs of providing services.		
25	E. To address the shortfall, King County has aggressively reviewed all		
26	expenditures in the general fund and other property-tax-supported funds for reductions		
27	and has reviewed possibilities for enhanced revenues.		
28	F. King County reduced the general fund budget and other property-tax-		
29	supported budgets below the amounts necessary to sustain current service levels through		
30	direct service reductions and efficiencies.		
31	G. Despite King County's efforts, the fiscal shortfall is expected to continue in		
32	2017 and thereafter, with the general fund shortfall for the 2017/2018 biennium currently		
33	projected to total \$48 million.		
34	H. The 2015/2016 Biennial Budget Ordinance assumes that property taxes		
35	increase by the one hundred and one-percent limit factor, and any increase less than that		
36	would require substantial direct service reductions.		
37	I. State law limits annual property tax increases to the lesser of one percent and		
38	the implicit price deflator. For 2016, the state has advised King County that the implicit		
39	price deflator is 0.251 percent.		
40	J. Since 1998, the implicit price deflator has only been less than one percent on		
41	three occasions in 1909, 2010 and 2016. For all other years, the implicit price deflator		

42	has exceeded one percent-ranging from 1.16 percent in 2003 to a high of 4.527 percent in		
43	2009. In those years, King County's annual property tax increases were limited to an		
44	increase of one percent.		
45	K. Because of the findings in subsections A. through J. of this section, the King		
46	County council finds that a substantial need exists for the use of property tax limit factors		
47	up to the maximum of one hundred one percent.		
48	SECTION 2. The limit factors to be used for county property tax levies for taxes		
49	to be collected in 2016 shall be as follows:		
50	Levy	Limit Factor	
51	Regular Levy	One hundred one percent	
52	Emergency Medical Services (EMS)	One hundred one percent	
53	County Road District	One hundred one percent	
54	Conservation Futures	One hundred one percent
