4	4 1. The solid waste division of t	he departme	ent of natural resources and
5	5 parks provides essential public	services that	t protect human health, the
6	6 environment, and the quality of	life in our r	region.
7	7 2. The solid waste division ope	erates the Ce	edar Hills regional landfill,
8	8 eight transfer stations, and two	drop boxes.	It also provides innovative
9	9 programs to help customers rec	ycle and pre	event waste.
10	3. The solid waste division is a	ın enterprise	fund, supporting almost all
11	(ninety-five percent) of its serv	ices with a b	pasic fee charged for each ton
12	of municipal solid waste receiv	ed at county	facilities.
13	4. The solid waste basic fee for	r 2013-2014	took effect on January 1, 2013,
14	with a further increase schedule	ed for the 20	015-2016 rate period.
15	5. By achieving efficiencies ar	nd refocusing	g priorities, the division

extended the 2013-2014 two-year rate for an additional two years, saving

customers twenty-two million dollars in 2015 and 2016.

18	6. A fee increase can no longer be deferred if the solid waste division is to
19	sustain current services, repay debt on previously approved transfer station
20	projects, plan and provide system handling and disposal capacity into the
21	future and expand recycling programs throughout the system.
22	7. The proposed new basic fee is less than the 2017 fee projected in the
23	last rate proposal and in line with rates charged by comparable solid waste
24	service providers in the region.
25	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
26	SECTION 1. A. This ordinance proposes changes to the fees currently charged
27	for solid waste disposal at solid waste transfer stations and drop boxes and at the Cedar
28	Hills regional landfill.
29	B. These fees are established and assessed pursuant to RCW 36.58.040, RCW
30	70.93.070 and K.C.C. 10.08.040.
31	SECTION 2. Ordinance 12586, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 10.12.021 are
32	each hereby amended as follows:
33	A. All persons using county-operated solid waste transfer stations and drop boxes
34	shall pay the service fees in the following schedules:
35	1. Solid waste disposal:
36	Passenger cars $$((19.22))$ 21.60 per entry
37	Other vehicles $$((120.17))$ <u>134.59</u> per ton

90	waste division director is binding upon the user.
91	G. The solid waste division director may establish fees for handling and
92	processing of recyclable materials for which no other fee has been established by
93	ordinance. Consistent with WRR-1, WRR-2, WWR-4 and WRR-36, the fees need not
94	recover the full cost of handling and processing."
95	EFFECT: Provides for a 12% rate increase across various rate categories
96	rather than increases of 14.6% for the base rate, 14.8% for the self-haul
97	rate, and similar increases across other categories.
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
