The DPH should ensure all licensed and recommended OSS Professionals provide this information to OSS owners. There is no need for the DPH to get involved other than through the permitting process.

Complaints should be filed with the Engineer's and Land Surveyors State Licensing Board who license these professionals should they not provide educational materials as required.

- 4. Funding for Educational Materials for Other Agencies:
 - a. Conservation Districts Throughout King County
 - b. Parks and Storm Water Staff
 - c. King County Permitting Agencies
 - d. Public Sewer Agencies

A simple inter agency memo to these agencies providing directions to existing websites would suffice.

In Conclusion:

The DPH has not sited any sources that suggest there is an additional need for further educational programs, taxes or staff manpower to implement an unwarranted extensive educational outreach program. These programs are currently in existence and mandated by state law.
