1 AN ORDINANCE relating to county property tax levies for
2 collection in 2017; implementing RCW 84.55.0101, finding
3 substantial need and providing for a limit factor of one
4 hundred and one percent in accordance with RCW
5 84.55.0101.

6 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

7 **SECTION 1. Findings:**

8 A. RCW 84.55.0101 allows the county council to set limit factors for regular
9 property tax levies to a maximum of one hundred one percent upon a finding of
10 substantial need.

11 B. The total adopted King County budget for 2017-2018 is \$10 billion and the
12 total adopted general fund budget for 2017-2018 is \$1.65 billion.

13 C. The general fund and other funds are continuing to experience a fiscal
14 shortfall that is the result of revenue growth that is not keeping pace with the increasing
15 costs of providing services.

16 D. The fiscal shortfall is expected to continue in 2018 and thereafter.

17 E. King County has aggressively reviewed all expenditures in the general fund
18 and other property-tax-supported funds for reductions and has reviewed possibilities for
19 enhanced revenues.

20 F. King County has reduced the general fund budget and other property-tax-
21 supported budgets below the amounts necessary to sustain current service levels through
22 direct service reductions and efficiencies.

23 G. The 2017-2018 Biennial Budget Ordinance assumes that property taxes
24 increase by the one-percent limit factor and any increase less than that would require
25 substantial direct service reductions.

26 H. Because of the findings in subsections A. through G. of this section, the King
27 County council finds that a substantial need exists for the use of property tax limit
28 factors up to the maximum of one hundred one percent.

29 SECTION 2. The limit factors to be used for county property tax levies for taxes
30 to be collected in 2017 shall be as follows:



32 Regular Levy	One hundred one percent
33 Emergency Medical Services (EMS)	One hundred one percent
34 County Road District	One hundred one percent
35 Conservation Futures	One hundred one percent


