1	AN ORDINANCE authorizing the vacation of a portion of
2	the B.W. Redding Road Extension No. 1 right-of-way, also
3	known as County Road No. 494, file V-2680, Petitioner:
4	Liway Hsi.
5	STATEMENT OF FACTS:
6	1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of the B.W.
7	Redding Road Extension No. 1 right-of-way, also known as County Road
8	No. 494, hereinafter described.
9	2. The department of transportation notified the various utility companies
10	serving the area and has been advised that easements are not required
11	within the vacation area.
12	3. The department of transportation records indicate that King County has
13	not expended public funds for the acquisition or maintenance of the
14	subject portion of B.W. Redding Road Extension No. 1 right-of-way.
15	4. The department of transportation considers the subject portion of right-
16	of-way useless as part of the county road system and believes the public
17	would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.
18	5. The right-of-way is classified as "C-Class" and, in accordance with
19	K.C.C. 14.40.020, the compensation due to King County is based on fifty

20	percent of the assessed value of the subject right-of-way, which was	
21	determined from records of the department of assessments. King County	
22	is in receipt of \$39.96 from the petitioner.	
23	6. Due notice was given in the manner provided by law. The office of the	
24	hearing examiner held the public hearing on October 24, 2016. The	
25	examiner concluded that the road segment subject to this petition is not	
26	useful as part of the King County road system and that the public will	
27	benefit from its vacation.	
28	7. In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation,	
29	the council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of	
30	King County to grant said petition.	
31	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:	
32	SECTION 1. The council, on the effective date of this ordinance, hereby vacates	
33	and abandons that portion of the B.W. Redding Road Extension No. 1 right-of-way, also	
34	known as County Road No. 494, as conveyed to King County by the recording of a Quit	
35	Claim Deed dated August 14, 1912, recorded in Volume 681 of Deeds, on Page 44,	
36	records of King County, Washington as described below:	
37	That portion of the B.W. Redding Road Extension No. 1 right-of-way,	
38	also known as County Road No. 494, in the Southeast quarter of Section	
39	29, Township 24 North, Range 8 East, Willamette Meridian, King County,	
40	Washington, located within the following described property:

41	Lots 2 and 3, of King County Large Lot Segregation No.
42	EMSC 13-0004, King County recording no.
43	20130816900001, records of King County, Washington.
44	EXCEPT any portion thereof lying within the SE 70th
45	Drive right-of-way, also known as George Stephan Road.





PUBLIC HEARING:

After reviewing the Department of Transportation (Department) report and accompanying attachments and exhibits, the Examiner conducted a public hearing on the matter on October 24, 2016, in the Fred Conference Room, 12th Floor, King County Courthouse, 516 Third Avenue, Seattle, Washington. We reopened the record on October 28, when we discovered some of the square footages did not match. The Department clarified the issue on October 31, thus re-closing the record.

Participants at the public hearing and the exhibits offered and entered are listed in the attached minutes. A verbatim recording of the hearing is available in the Hearing Examiner's Office. Having reviewed the record in this matter, the Examiner now makes and enters the following:

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS:

1. General information:

Road name and location: Portion of B.W. Redding road extension no. 1, aka

County road no. 494

Right-of-way classification:

C-Class

Area:

23,542 square feet

Compensation:

\$39.96

- 2. Claremont Forest LLC petitioned the County to vacate the above described public right-of-way. On September 30, 2016, the Examiner received the Department report recommending approval.
- 3. The required notice of hearing was provided. The Examiner conducted the public hearing on behalf of the Metropolitan King County Council.
- 4. Except as provided herein, the Examiner adopts and incorporates the facts set forth in the Department's report and the statements of fact contained in proposed ordinance no. 2016-0457. Specifically, the report lists an incorrect square footage to be vacated; the correct number is 23,542. The Department's report will be attached to those copies of this report and recommendation that are submitted to the County Council.
- 5. Maps showing the vicinity of the proposed vacation and the specific area to be vacated are in the hearing record as exhibits 13, 15, and 16.
- 6. Chapter 36.87 RCW sets the general framework for county road vacations, augmented by KCC Chapter 14.40. The standard is that:

If the county road is found useful as a part of the county road system it *shall* not be vacated, but if it is not useful and the public will be benefited by the vacation, the county legislative authority *may* vacate the road or any portion thereof.

RCW 36.87.060(1) (emphasis added). So while denial is mandatory where a petitioner fails to meet the standard, approval is discretionary where a petitioner does meet the standard. Where approval is warranted, the final question is what compensation is appropriate.

- 7. The subject right-of-way segment was acquired by a 1912 quitclaim deed. No public funds were expended in its acquisition, it is not currently opened, constructed or maintained for public use, and it is not known to be used informally for access to any property. Vacation of the right-of-way would have no adverse effect on the provision of access and fire and emergency services to the abutting properties and surrounding area. The right-of-way is not necessary for the present or future public road system for travel or utilities purposes.
- 8. As a "C-Class" road, compensation is based on 50% of the assessed valuation, as determined by County staff. Here, because the surrounding property is zoned Forest and the property is used as a tree farm, the proceeds the public gains from essentially selling surplus property is only \$39.96. Yet the public also gains (slightly) from adding the road area to the permanent tax rolls. Moreover, the County is saved potential costs, as a property owner, for something like cleaning up illegal dumping on the road area, and the general risk the liability a property owner (especially an absentee one) carries. Here the landowner seeks to incorporate the right-of-way area into ongoing tree farm operations, and will clean up the invasive Scotch broom currently on the swath.
- 9. The \$39.96 compensation required by law to be paid as a condition precedent to vacation of this road has already been deposited with King County.
- 10. We conclude that the road segment subject to this petition is not useful as part of the King County road system and that the public will benefit from its vacation.

RECOMMENDATION:

APPROVE proposed ordinance no. 2016-0457 to vacate the subject road right-of-way.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL

Prior mailing is not sufficient if the Clerk does not actually receive the fee and the appeal statement within the applicable time period.

Unless the appeal requirements of KCC 20.22.230 are met, the Clerk of the Council will place on the agenda of the next available Council meeting a proposed ordinance implementing the Examiner's recommended action.

If the appeal requirements of KCC 20.22.230 are met, the Examiner will notify parties and interested persons and will provide information about "next steps."
