**KING COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH
NOTICE OF RULEMAKING – BOH 17-01
A Regulation on the Posting of
Food Safety Ratings at
General Food Service Establishments**

Pursuant to its authority under RCW 70.05.060, the King County Board of Health hereby gives notice of proposed rulemaking to adopt requirements for the posting of food safety ratings at general food service establishments.

The purpose of the proposed rulemaking is to establish a system of providing public notification of food safety rating symbols at general food service establishments (for example, restaurants, coffee shops, delis and bars). The proposed rule requires the posting of placards, at the main public entrances of the establishments, displaying the food safety rating symbols based on the four most recent routine food safety inspections of the establishments and compared with the food safety ratings of other establishments of similar risk category and geographic location. The rule also establishes an incremental scale of penalties for noncompliance, from one-half the applicable permit fee for the first offense, up to twice the applicable permit fee for the third or subsequent offense in any two year period.

A public hearing on the proposed rule at which the public may state their views orally or in writing will be held during the regular meeting of the King County Board of Health, January 19, 2017 at 1:30 p.m. in the Metropolitan King County Council Chambers, 10th floor, Courthouse, 516 Third Avenue, Seattle, WA.
