Councilmember Lambert reported on the Prosecuting Attorney Office's 180 Degree Workshop. The workshop is a youth diversion program and Councilmember Lambert encouraged members to attend one in the future.

Councilmember Lambert attended the Mercer Island regional field training of amateur radio operators. The training was an emergency planning exercise and was attended by representatives from the public and private sectors.

Councilmember Phillips reported on Sound Transit Board. The Board reviewed preferred alignment choices for the Federal Way Link light rail extension. A preferred location will be selected at its July meeting. The Board also adopted station names for the Eastlink extension and approved a six month extension to the existing bus operations and maintenance service contract.

Councilmember Phillips reported on the Cedar River Council. The Council discussed planning for the future and how to provide greater outreach.
