She thanked the cities of Issaquah and Sammamish for the smooth transition.

Councilmember Phillips reported on the first annual Chomp Celebration held at Marymoor Park in Redmond. Chomp is King County's first local food and sustainable living festival and it included a Farm to Table dinner. Councilmember Phillips encouraged everyone to attend the event next year.
