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### 9. Proposed Ordinance No. 2015-0278

AN ORDINANCE accepting a petition, establishing boundaries and ordering an election to determine formation of a proposed irrigation district in King County to be known as the Snoqualmie Valley Watershed Improvement District and for the purpose of electing directors for the district.

A MOTION acknowledging receipt of a report recognizing full implementation of Recommendation #5 of the September 11, 2013, performance audit of environmental health services, and approving an action plan for improving the operational infrastructure of environmental health services in order to lower permit costs and encourage vendor participation while maintaining food safety, in compliance with the 2015/2016 Biennial Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 17941, Section 98, Proviso P2.

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**Sponsors:** Mr. Upthegrove

This matter had its first reading and was referred to the Health, Housing and Human Services Committee.

# 16. Reports on Special and Outside Committees

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Councilmember Lambert reported on the 4Culture board meeting, including preliminary budget discussions and the grant process.

Councilmember Hague announced that 500 of the largest urban counties will be in Seattle for the Innovation Seminar, including discussions of criminal justice.

Councilmember Phillips reported on the Sound Transit board meeting, which discussed the proposed 2016 budget, the U-link extension and a resolutions regarding

the acquisition of additional light rail vehicle fleet expansion and amending the Northgate Link Extension baseline budget.

Councilmember Phillips also reported on the Zoo board meeting which included an update on polling regarding the public's perceptions of the zoo, the movement of the elephants to Oklahoma and governance of the zoo for 2016.
