Councilmember Gossett moved to extend Lauren Bergeson's tempoary assignment to the Office of Law Enforcement Oversight to August 31, 2016. The motion passed unanimously.

5. Action report: Reduce the work hours for the Interim Director of the Office of Law Enforcement Oversight

Ms. Busch reported on a request to decrease the hours of Cheryle Broom, the interim director of the Office of Law Enforcement Oversight, from 75 % to 60%, effective May 1, 2016 through June 24, 2016.

Councilmember Gossett moved to decrease Ms. Brrom's hours as outlined by Ms. Busch. The motion passed unanimously.
