9. Proposed Substitute Ordinance No. 2017-0232.2

AN ORDINANCE providing for the submission to the qualified electors of King County at a special election to be held in King County on November 7, 2017, a proposition authorizing a property tax levy in excess of the levy limitations contained in chapter 84.55 RCW for a consecutive six-year period at a rate of not more than ten cents per one thousand dollars of assessed valuation in the first year, and limiting annual levy increases to three percent in the five succeeding years, all for the purpose of supporting veterans and military servicemembers and their respective families; seniors and their caregivers; and vulnerable populations in King County by funding capital facilities and regional health and human services to promote housing stability, healthy living, financial stability, social engagement and health and human services system improvements and system access; providing for limited mitigation of prorationing of metropolitan park districts and fire districts levies to the extent the prorationing was caused by this levy; directing proposal of a transition plan and an implementation plan for the veterans, seniors and human services levy; and directing proposal of an ordinance to create an oversight board or boards, contingent upon voter approval of the levy.

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Greg Doss and Laura Hitchcock, Council Staff, briefed the committee and answered questions from the members. Adrienne Quinn, Director, and Leo Flor, Veterans and Human Services Levy Renewal Manager, Department of Community and Human Services, also answered questions from the members.

Councilmember McDermott moved striking amendment S2.

Councilmember Kohl-Welles moved amendment 1 to S2. The amendment passed unanimously.

Councilmember Kohl-Welles moved amendment 2 to S2. The amendment passed unanimously.

Councilmember Dembowski moved amendment 3 to S2. The amendment passed unanimously.

Councilmember Gossett moved amendment 9 to S2. The amendment passed unanimously.

Councilmember Balducci moved amendment 10 to S2. The amendment passed unanimously.

Councilmember Kohl-Welles offered an oral amendment to S2 on line 270, strike "childcare" and insert "child care". The amendment was accepted as friendly. Councilmember Kohl-Welles offered an oral amendment to S2 on line 120, after "one hundred thousand persons with" insert "physical,". The amendment was accepted as friendly.

Striking amendment S2, as amended, passed by a vote of five ayes (Councilmembers McDermott, Balducci, Gossett, Kohl-Welles and Lambert), and two noes (Councilmembers Dembowski and Upthegrove).

Councilmember Lambert moved title amendment T1. The amendment passed unanimously.

This item was expedited to the July 5, 2017 Council Agenda.

A motion was made by Councilmember Lambert that this Ordinance be Passed Out of Committee Without a Recommendation, Substitute version 3. The motion carried by the following vote:
