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Councilmember Lambert alerted the members of an imminent danger of biosolids running down a hill side into a river in the Snoqualmie forest. Ms. Lambert also shared the information in the newspaper regarding stop signs, the latest property delay in the Eastside trail completion. The article discusses the two intersections on a steep incline which results in limited space for one or two cars without affecting Highway 202. She noted that this topic just went to court and is now winding its way through Court of Appeals.

Mr. Dembowski raised a point of inquiry on receiving a copy of Proposed Ordinance 2017-0342. Voting on Ms. Lambert's motion, the motion failed, 2 to 6, Ms. Lambert and Mr. von Reichbauer voting "yes", Mr. Dunn excused.

Ms. Kohl-Welles raised a point of inquiry on all the possible actions available to Council. Kevin Wright, Chief Civil Deputy Prosecuting Attorney, explained the procedure.

This matter had its first reading and was referred to the Health, Housing and Human Services Committee.
