1 AN ORDINANCE authorizing annual funding allocation  
2 procedures for conservation futures funds; creating the  
3 conservation futures fund; making technical corrections to  
4 first tier fund titles and numbers; and amending Ordinance  
5 13717, Section 1, and K.C.C. 26.12.003, Ordinance 8867,  
6 Section 1, as amended, and K.C.C. 26.12.010 and  
7 Ordinance 12076, Section 9, as amended, and K.C.C.  
8 4.08.015, adding a new section to K.C.C. chapter 2.36,  
9 adding a new section to K.C.C. chapter 4.08 and adding a  
10 new section to K.C.C. chapter 26.12.

13 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

14 **SECTION 1. Findings:**

15 For the purposes of meeting King County's adopted planning policies pursuant to  
16 the state of Washington Growth Management Act, the King County council makes the  
17 following findings:

18           A. There continues to exist in King County a need to provide a system of public  
19 open spaces necessary for the health, welfare, benefit and safety of the residents of King  
20 County and to maintain King county as a desirable place to live, visit and locate  
21 businesses.

22           B. King County's open space resources continue to diminish due to dramatic  
23 growth in this region, with an expected gain in new residents of over two hundred  
24 thousand people by the year 2020. Unless necessary property interests in such open  
25 space resources are acquired, important open space resources are highly likely to be  
26 developed and lost forever.

27           C. For the purposes of meeting the requirements of the state of Washington  
28 Growth Management Act, as specified under RCW 36.70A.210, King County has  
29 established a countywide framework to develop comprehensive plans under Ordinance  
30 10450, including policies requiring incorporated jurisdictions to work together to  
31 identify, protect and acquire King County's diminishing open space resources and  
32 establish a regional open space system.

33           D. Conservation futures tax levy funds, authorized under RCW 84.34.230 are an  
34 important means of retaining community character and accomplishing open space  
35 policies and objectives of Ordinance 10450 and RCW 84.34.200.

36           E. King County is authorized by RCW 84.34.210 and 84.34.220 to acquire open  
37 space, farm and agricultural lands and timber lands, as defined in RCW 84.34.020.

38           NEW SECTION. SECTION 2. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 2.36 a  
39 new section to read as follows:

40           **Citizen oversight committee.**

41           A. The citizen oversight committee is hereby established as an advisory body to  
42 carry out the duties prescribed for the committee in K.C.C. chapter 26.12.

43           B. The committee shall include an individual who resides in each King County  
44 council district and three additional at-large members. The committee shall be appointed  
45 by the executive and confirmed by the council. The committee shall elect a chair from its  
46 members. The executive shall solicit nominations from the King County council, from  
47 the city of Seattle and from suburban cities within King County and shall seek  
48 representation of a broad spectrum of interests and expertise, including, but not limited  
49 to, local conservation and passive recreation, science and ecology, conservation land  
50 stewardship, business and education.

51           C. Once established, the terms of the members and chair shall be four years and  
52 shall be rotated such that eight of the seats become available for appointment every two  
53 years. Committee appointments and operations are subject to K.C.C. Title 3, including  
54 code of ethics and civil rights provisions.

55           NEW SECTION. SECTION 3. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 4.08 a  
56 new section to read as follows:

57           **Conservation futures fund.** There is hereby created the conservation futures  
58 fund, which shall be used for the purposes of K.C.C. chapter 26.12. The fund is a first  
59 tier fund as defined in K.C.C. 4.08.005. The department of natural resources and parks  
60 shall be the fund manager. All conservation futures tax levy funds shall be deposited in  
61 the fund. The definitions in K.C.C. 26.12.003 apply to this section.

62           SECTION 4. Ordinance 13717, Section 1, and K.C.C. 26.12.003 are each hereby  
63 amended to read as follows:

64           **Definitions - K.C.C. 26.12.003 through ~~((26.12.010)) 26.12.030 and section 6~~**  
65 **of this ordinance.** The definitions in this section apply throughout ~~((this section and~~  
66 ~~K.C.C. 26.12.020 - 26.12.005 as recodified by Ordinance 13717 and 26.12.010)) K.C.C.~~  
67 ~~26.12.003 through 26.12.030 and section 6 of this ordinance~~ unless the context clearly  
68 requires otherwise.

69           A. "Annual allocation" means the allocation of conservation futures tax levy  
70 funds collected in the ~~((previous))~~ ensuing budget year and other moneys deposited in the  
71 conservation futures fund.

72           B. ~~((“Annual collection period” means the calendar year in which conservation~~  
73 ~~futures tax levy funds are collected, which is the year preceding their expenditure.~~

74           ~~C.))~~ ~~((Conservation futures e))~~ Citizen oversight committee means the ~~((King~~  
75 ~~County conservation futures))~~ citizen((s)) oversight committee, established under  
76 ~~((K.C.C. 26.12.010))~~ section 2 of this ordinance.

77           ~~((D.))~~ C. "Conservation futures tax levy funds" means ~~((that King County))~~  
78 moneys collected through the tax levy upon all taxable property in King County  
79 authorized by RCW 84.34.230.

80           ~~((E.))~~ D. "Conservation futures fund" means the King County conservation  
81 futures fund established under ~~((K.C.C. 26.12.010))~~ section 3 of this ordinance.

82           ~~((F.))~~ E. "Governmental agency" and "agency" mean King County, the city of  
83 Seattle ~~((and))~~ or any ~~((incorporated))~~ suburban city ~~((jurisdiction within the county)).~~

84           ~~((G. Interlocal agreement” means the agreement provided for in Ordinance 13717~~  
85 ~~to be entered into between King County and each other governmental agency.~~

86           ~~H.))~~ F. "Open space land" means the fee simple ~~((or any lesser interest,~~

87 development right including conservation futures, easement, covenant or other  
88 contractual right necessary to protect, preserve, maintain, improve, restore, limit the  
89 future use of or otherwise conserve, selected)) interest in open space land, farm and  
90 agricultural land and timber land as those terms are defined in chapter 84.34 RCW, for  
91 public use or enjoyment, or any lesser interest in those lands, including development  
92 rights, conservation futures, easement, covenant or other contractual right necessary to  
93 protect, preserve, maintain, improve, restore, limit the future use of or otherwise conserve  
94 the land.

95 ((F)) G. "Project" means open space land to which King County conservation  
96 futures tax levy funds are allocated for acquisition under the processes under K.C.C.  
97 26.12.010.

98 ((J. "Seattle" means the city of Seattle, Washington.

99 K.)) H. "Suburban city" means each incorporated ((suburban)) city  
100 ((jurisdiction)) or town in King County, except the city of Seattle.

101 SECTION 5. Ordinance 8867, Section.1, as amended, and K.C.C. 26.12.010 are  
102 each hereby amended to read as follows:

103 Conservation futures fund – ((A))allocation of conservation futures tax levy  
104 funds.

105 A process is hereby established for the annual allocation ((commencing January 1,  
106 2000)) of the conservation futures tax levy funds, ((except as provided in Ordinance  
107 10750 establishing the regional conservation futures 1993 bond acquisition program)) to  
108 acquire ((fee simple or development rights in)) open space lands, including green spaces,  
109 greenbelts, wildlife habitat and trail rights-of-way proposed for preservation for public

110 use by either the county or the cities within the county. King County (~~government,~~  
111 ~~incorporated city governments~~), cities within the ((King C)) county, citizen groups and  
112 citizens may make application for funds in this allocation process.

113 A. The county executive shall determine a(~~n application submission~~) date, no  
114 later than (~~March~~) April 1, ((following an annual collection period)) as a deadline for  
115 submission of applications for use of conservation futures tax levy funds. At least one  
116 month (~~prior to~~) before the application submission deadline date, the executive shall  
117 provide all cities within the county notice of the opportunity to apply to the county for a  
118 share of the annual allocation of the conservation futures tax levy funds available for that  
119 year. Notice also shall be provided in (~~a daily~~) the official county newspaper ((of  
120 general county circulation)).

121 B. No later than March (~~30 following an annual collection period~~) 1, the county  
122 council may(~~, at its discretion,~~) adopt a motion that provides direction to the citizen  
123 oversight committee(~~, identified in Ordinance 13717,~~) on priorities for evaluating  
124 (~~such~~) the applications within the open space criteria identified in (~~Ordinance 13717~~)  
125 K.C.C. 27.02.025.

126 C.1. By (~~June 1 following an annual collection period~~) July 15, the citizen  
127 oversight committee(~~, identified in Ordinance 13717,~~) shall make (~~application funding~~)  
128 project recommendations and recommend funding allocations for each project to the  
129 executive, including:

- 130 a. a description of each project including project location and acreage;  
131 b. a report on how each project meets the county open space selection criteria,  
132 contained in K.C.C. 26.12.025, and

133 c. the amount of funding requested in each project application, and  
134 d. any additional relevant criteria of the jurisdiction in which the potential  
135 acquisition is located.

136 2. The committee's recommendations are solely advisory and the executive  
137 and/or the council may adopt, alter, add to or decline to adopt all or part of the  
138 committee's recommendations in the budget process.

139 D. ((By August 1, the executive shall transmit to the council the citizen oversight  
140 committee's recommendation, the executive's recommendation, and a report on the  
141 compliance of all applications submitted for funding with the county open space selection  
142 criteria, contained in Ordinance 13717 and any additional relevant criteria of the  
143 jurisdiction in which the potential acquisition is located)). The executive's ((transmittal  
144 shall)) project and funding recommendation shall be ((accompanied by a)) included in the  
145 annual proposed appropriation ordinance for the ensuing budget year.

146 ~~((D. The citizen oversight committee shall include an individual from each King~~  
147 ~~County council district and up to three additional at large members. The committee shall~~  
148 ~~be appointed by the executive and confirmed by the council. The committee shall elect a~~  
149 ~~chair from its members. The executive shall solicit nominations from the King County~~  
150 ~~Council, the city of Seattle and from suburban cities and shall seek representation of a~~  
151 ~~broad spectrum of interests and expertise, including but not limited to local conservation~~

159 F.)) E.1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection E. 2 and 3 of this section,  
160 ~~((A))~~any application funded by this process shall be sponsored and forwarded by the  
161 jurisdiction in which the project is located. The jurisdiction ~~((will))~~ shall commit to  
162 providing a matching contribution no less than the amount of conservation futures tax  
163 levy funds ~~((awarded to))~~ appropriated for the project before conservation futures tax  
164 levy funds are reimbursed to that jurisdiction. This contribution may consist of cash, land  
165 trades with a valuation verified by an appraisal by a Member of the Appraisal Institute  
166 (MAI) certified appraiser or the cash value, excluding King County conservation futures  
167 contributions, of other open spaces acquired within the previous two years that is either  
168 directly adjacent to the project or the county concludes to be directly linked to the  
169 property under application. ~~((When a project nominated by a citizen or citizen group is~~  
170 ~~located within an incorporated city or in unincorporated King County and is~~  
171 ~~recommended for acquisition by the citizen oversight committee, the applicant is required~~  
172 ~~to demonstrate in the application for conservation futures tax funds a commitment by the~~  
173 ~~jurisdiction in which the project is located to contribute within two years of application~~  
174 ~~the required share for the project.~~

175 ~~G. A five hundred thousand dollar balance will be reserved at the beginning of~~  
176 ~~each year to be used at the discretion of the council during the annual county budget~~  
177 ~~process to fund parcels that satisfy the county open space selection criteria in Ordinance~~  
178 ~~13717. Beginning with the 2001 county budget process and on an annual basis thereafter,~~



179 five percent of the total conservation futures fund revenues, net of debt service and  
180 contracted encumbrances, shall be added to the five hundred thousand dollar balance.

181 H.) 2. A jurisdiction may make an application in partnership with one or more  
182 jurisdictions if the proposed project lies wholly within the boundaries of those  
183 jurisdictions, or if another reason for such a partnership is articulated within the  
184 application, such as a trail connection, a community separator or coordinated salmon  
185 habitat preservation. In such a partnership application, the relationship, roles and  
186 responsibilities for acquisition, ownership, matching contribution obligations and future  
187 maintenance must be described. If a partnership application is funded by this process, the  
188 jurisdictions shall be required to enter into an interlocal agreement with the county  
189 formalizing the relationship, roles and responsibilities for acquisition, ownership,  
190 matching contribution obligations and future maintenance.

191 3. For an application by a citizen or citizen group for a project in the city of  
192 Seattle, the citizen or citizen group shall commit to providing a matching contribution no  
193 less than the amount of conservation futures tax levy funds appropriated for the project.  
194 This contribution may consist of cash, in-kind voluntary contributions or land donations  
195 with a valuation verified by an appraisal by a Member of the Appraisal Institute (MAI)  
196 certified appraiser or the cash value, excluding King County conservation futures  
197 contributions, of other open spaces acquired within the previous two years that is either  
198 directly adjacent to the project or the county concludes to be directly linked to the  
199 property under application. For a project based on an application by a citizen or citizen  
200 group, the funds shall be reimbursed to the jurisdiction in which the project is located. If  
201 a citizen or citizen group's application is funded by this process, the jurisdiction in which

202 the project is located shall be required to enter into an interlocal agreement with the  
203 county formalizing the relationship, roles and responsibilities for acquisition, ownership,  
204 matching contribution obligations and future maintenance.

205 F. Conservation futures tax levy (~~collections~~) funds shall be deposited in the  
206 (~~King County~~) conservation futures fund(~~;~~) for the purpose of administering,  
207 disbursing and accounting for conservation futures tax levy funds authorized by King  
208 County. Conservation futures tax levy funds (~~will~~) shall be disbursed to projects  
209 previously approved by King County upon receipt and verification by King County of  
210 properly completed requests for payment of the funds. The (~~the~~)office of (~~Financial~~  
211 ~~M~~)management and budget shall prescribe the form for the requests. The disbursement  
212 requests shall be made only for capital project expenditures that include all costs of  
213 acquiring real property, including interests in real property, and the following costs,  
214 though it shall not include the cost of preparing applications for conservation futures  
215 moneys: (~~the~~) cost of related relocation of eligible occupants(~~;~~); cost of appraisal(~~;~~);  
216 cost of appraisal review(~~;~~); cost of title insurance(~~;~~); closing costs(~~;~~); pro rata real  
217 estate taxes(~~;~~); recording fees(~~;~~); compensating tax(~~;~~); hazardous waste substances  
218 reports(~~;~~); directly related staff costs(~~;~~); and related legal and administrative costs(~~;~~  
219 ~~but shall not include the cost of preparing applications for conservation futures funds~~)).  
220 The city shall transmit payment to its payees for current capital project costs within five  
221 days of the receipt by the city of its requested conservation futures tax levy funds. The  
222 city shall provide a list of authorized individuals to certify requests to King County. The  
223 city is responsible for the accuracy of the payment requests and the propriety and  
224 timeliness of its disbursements following receipt of conservation futures tax levy funds.

225 Conservation futures tax levy funds may not be used to acquire any property or interest  
226 therein through the exercise of the power of eminent domain.

227 ~~((I. If there are unexpended project allocations, including but not limited to  
228 project completion at less than estimated cost or abandonment of projects, the affected  
229 governmental agency shall notify King County, which may reallocate the unexpended  
230 fund proceeds to an approved project scope change or to another approved project.~~

231 ~~F.))~~ G. Projects carried out by a governmental agency in whole or part with  
232 conservation futures tax levy funds shall not be transferred or conveyed except by  
233 interlocal agreement providing that the land or interest in land shall be continued to be  
234 used for the purposes of ~~((this ordinance))~~ K.C.C. 26.12.005 through 26.12.025 and in  
235 strict conformance with the uses authorized under RCW 84.34.230. Also, the land or  
236 interest in land shall not be converted to a different use unless other equivalent lands  
237 within the geographic jurisdiction of the governmental agency are received in exchange  
238 for the lands or interest in lands. This section does not prevent the grant of easements or  
239 franchises or the making of joint use agreements or other operations compatible with the  
240 use of a project as provided for in this section and authorized under RCW 84.34.230.

241 NEW SECTION. SECTION 6. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 26.12 a  
242 new section to read as follows:

243 **Project reporting and reallocations.**

244 A. Each governmental agency receiving conservation futures tax levy funds and  
245 the department of natural resources and parks shall furnish a report to the executive by  
246 January 31 of each year. The report shall include for each project:

- 247 1. The amount of conservation futures tax levy funds expended;

- 248 2. The amount of conservation futures tax levy funds remaining;
- 249 3. The status of matching funds;
- 250 4. The amount of acreage purchased;
- 251 5. A brief description of all acquisition activity, such as contact with
- 252 landowners, title and appraisal research conducted and offers extended;
- 253 6. The expected timeline for project completion;
- 254 7. Any requested scope change description as defined in K.C.C. 4.04.020;
- 255 8. Any change in project description;
- 256 9. Any request for project abandonment; and
- 257 10. Any significant obstacles or barriers to project completion.

258 B. The citizen oversight committee may recommend to the council the  
259 reallocation of conservation futures tax levy funds for any project for which the  
260 appropriated funds have not been encumbered and expended within a reasonable time  
261 period.

262 SECTION 7. Ordinance 12076, Section 9, as amended, and K.C.C. 4.08.015 are  
263 each hereby amended to read as follows:

264 **First tier funds and designated fund managers.**

265 A. First tier funds and fund managers are as follows:

266 B. The following shall also be first tier funds:

267 1. All funds now or hereafter established by ordinance for capital construction  
268 through specific road improvement districts, utility local improvement districts or local  
269 improvement districts. The director of the department of transportation shall be the fund  
270 manager for transportation-related funds. The director of the department of natural  
271 resources and parks shall be the fund manager for utility-related funds.

272 2. All county funds that receive original proceeds of borrowings made under  
273 Chapter 216, Washington Laws of 1982, as now existing or hereafter amended, to the  
274 extent of the amounts then outstanding for the borrowings for that fund. For purposes of  
275 this subsection, the director of the county department or office primarily responsible for


