## Description of request:

This ordinance will enable King County to sign and implement the Consent Decree with the United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Washington State Department of Ecology to clean up sediment contamination at the Lower Duwamish Waterway Superfund Site under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act ("CERCLA") and the Washington State Model Toxics Control Act ("MTCA"). The Consent Decree has a settlement attachment that specifies the future cost payments to be made by the cash-out and funding parties responsible for the cleanup.
