1 AN ORDINANCE relating to no shooting areas;
 2 establishing a second no shooting area within the Crow
 3 voting precinct; and amending Ordinance 15510, Section 2,
 4 and K.C.C. 12.68.963

5 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

6 **SECTION 1. Findings:**

7 A. Under K.C.C. 12.68.010, elector-residents may petition the county requesting
 8 the creation of a no shooting area. A petition, which is Attachment A to this ordinance,
 9 was submitted to the council on September 8, 2022, to designate a second no shooting
 10 area in the Crow voting precinct.

11 B. In accordance with K.C.C. 12.68.010.B., the elections department verified that
 12 a sufficient number of elector-residents signed the petition. The certificate of sufficiency
 13 is Attachment B to this ordinance.

14 C. In 2006 the council designated a no shooting area in the Crow voting precinct
 15 through Ordinance 15510. The area proposed for designation would be a separate no
 16 shooting area in the Crow precinct to the east of the existing no shooting area established
 17 by K.C.C. 12.68.963.A.1.

18 D. The area proposed for designation as a no shooting area is in close proximity
 19 to both Walter A. Jellum Recreation Area, also known as "Jellum Park", and a local

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20 equestrian facility that often hosts lessons and clinics for children. Jellum Park is
21 frequented by hikers, dogwalkers, horseback riders, and people on off-road vehicles.

22 E. The area used for shooting is not marked or sectioned off. Shooting occurs
23 there at random times throughout the day and sometimes takes place less than five
24 hundred feet from the equestrian buildings. The random shooting could potentially cause
25 the horses to panic and bolt, which could cause injuries for the rider.

26 F. Trail riding and hiking in this area is dangerous as the shooters do not shoot
27 into an earthen berm and do not refrain from shooting in the presence of people and
28 horses.

29 G. Thirty-two individuals signed on to the petition with ten signatures determined
30 by the department of elections to be registered voters of the Crow voting precinct.

31 H. In accordance with K.C.C. 12.68.010.C., and after considering the location,
32 terrain and surrounding land use of the petitioned area, the council finds the formation of
33 a second no shooting area in the Crow precinct is beneficial to the public health, safety
34 and general welfare.

35 SECTION 2. Ordinance 15510, Section 2, and K.C.C. 12.68.963 are hereby
36 amended to read as follows:

37 A. The shooting of firearms is prohibited and ~~((a))~~ two no shooting areas ~~((is))~~
38 are established within the Crow voting precinct~~((:))~~ and are described as follows:

39 ~~((B. The area is in those))~~ 1. Those portions of Sections 2 & 3, Township 21
40 North, Range 6 East, W.M. that are bounded by SE 288th Street (south line of Section
41 35) on the north, Maple Valley-Black Diamond Rd on the west, southeast 305 Street

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42 (Black Diamond corporate limits) on the south and Black Diamond-Ravensdale Rd on the
43 east; and

44 2. Those portions of Township 21 North, Range 7 East, W.M. comprised of the
45 northeast and northwest quarters of Section 8 and the east half of the northeast quarter of
46 Section 7.


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47 B. Maps of the two no shooting areas established by subsection A. of this section
48 are Attachment C to this ordinance.

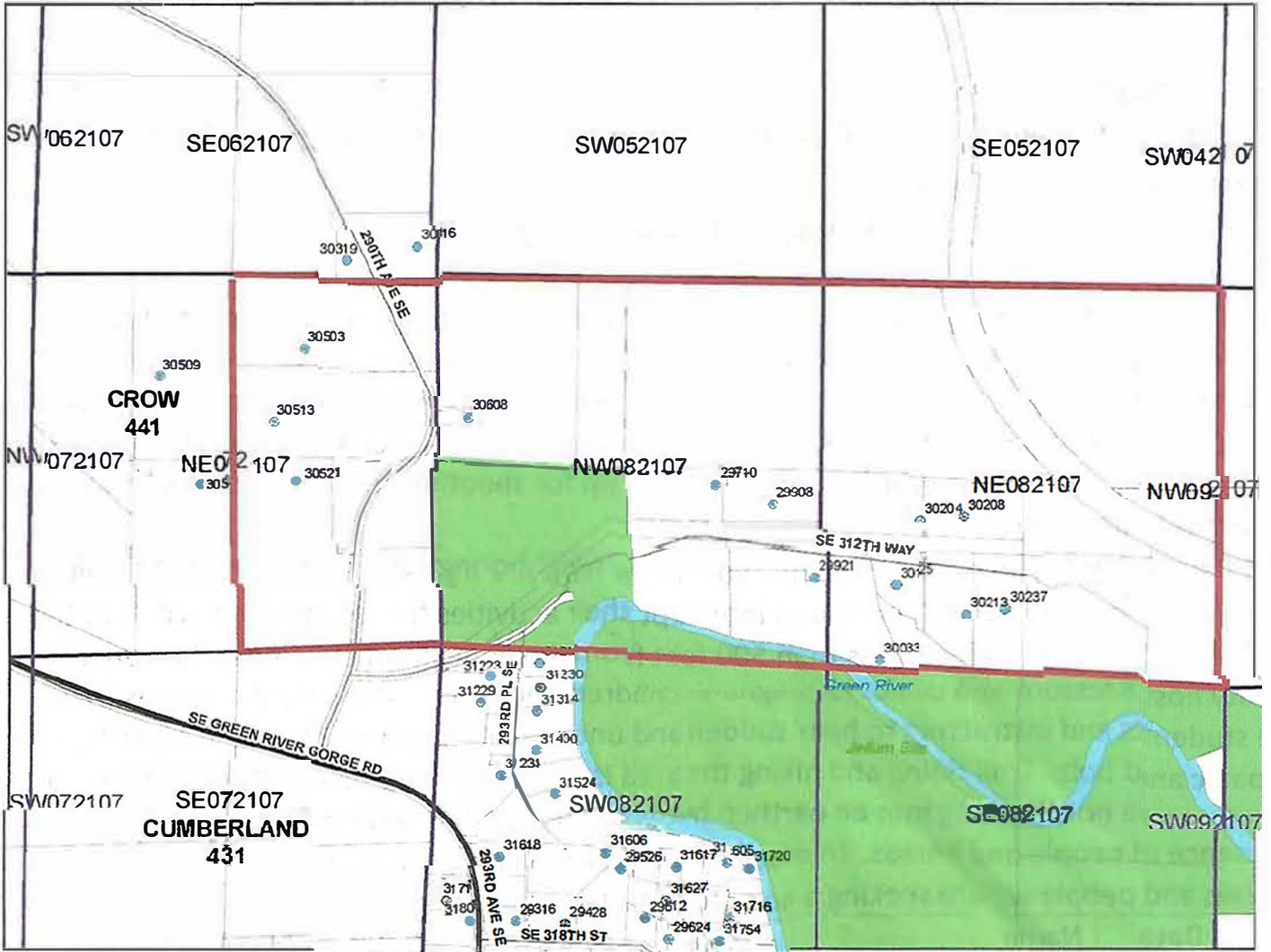
Petition to create a No Shooting Area-Voting precinct crow (2)

Legal Description: The area is in Township 21, Range 7, and is comprised of the East half of the NE quarter of Section 7, the NW quarter of Section 8 and the NE quarter of Section 8. (see map on back)

Situation-(reason for petition)

This petition seeks to protect people and domestic animals roaming the designated rural residential and forested area. Most of the area is private forested land but also includes Washington State Jellum Park and an equestrian facility which have domestic animals coming and going throughout the trails. These areas are traveled by dog walkers, horseback riders, hikers as well as off-road vehicles. The areas set up for shooting are random, no berm and no setbacks of any sort.

The equestrian facility has been permitted use by neighboring forest land owners to walk and ride the trails. Individuals have had to interrupt their activities for safety reasons due to the random shooting sometimes less than 500 feet from the equestrian buildings. The Equine facility hosts lessons and clinics for beginner children and adults. It is very dangerous for all the students and instructors to hear sudden and unexpected shooting causing a 1200 lb. horse to panic and bolt. Trail riding and hiking the area is dangerous and scary because the people shooting are not shooting into an earthen berm and do not restrain from shooting in the presence of people and horses. In order to secure a safe pleasant environment for both horses and people we are seeking a no shooting area.
