8		2. The department of transportation notified the various utility companies
9.		serving the area and has been advised that easements were not required
10	٠	within the vacation area.
11		3. The department of transportation records indicate that King County has
12		not been maintaining 114th Avenue SE and SE 172nd Street. The records
13		indicate that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition.
14		4. The department of transportation considers the subject portion of the
15		right-of-way useless as part of the county road system and believes the
16	-	public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax
17		rolls.

18	5. The right-of-way is classified as "C-Class" and, in accordance with
19	K.C.C. 14.40.020, the compensation due King County is based on fifty
20	percent of the assessed value of the subject right-of-way, which was
21	determined from records of the department of assessments. King County
22	is in receipt of \$1,419.00 from the petitioner.
23	Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the
24	office of the hearing examiner on the 4th day of August, 2004.
25 °	In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the council
26	has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant
27	said petition.
28	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

DEPARTMENT'S REPORT:

The Department of Transportation's written report to the King County Hearing Examiner for Item No. V-2472 was received by the Examiner on July 19, 2004.

PUBLIC HEARING:

After reviewing the Department of Transportation's Report and examining available information on file with the petition, the Examiner conducted a public hearing on the subject as follows:

V-2472—Glacier, LLC

The hearing on Item No. V-2472 was opened by the Examiner at 9:35 a.m., on August 4, 2004, in the Hearing Examiner's Conference Room, 400 Yesler Way, Seattle, WA 98104, and continued at 9:50 a.m. The hearing record closed on September 2, 2004. Participants at the public hearing and the exhibits offered and entered are listed in the attached minutes. A verbatim recording of the hearing is available in the office of the King County Hearing Examiner.

<u>FINDINGS</u>, <u>CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATION</u>: Having reviewed the record in this matter, the Examiner now makes and enters the following:

FINDINGS:

1. General Information:

Road name and location:

Portion of 114th Avenue SE and SE 172nd Street

8,702 sq. ft.

Area: Compensation:

- 2. Except as provided below, the Examiner adopts and incorporates herein by this reference the facts set forth in the Department of Transportation's report to the King County Hearing Examiner for the August 4, 2004, public hearing and the statement of facts contained in Proposed Ordinance No. 2004-0259. The Department's report will be attached to those copies of this report and recommendation that are submitted to the Metropolitan King County Council.
- 3. Maps showing the vicinity of the proposed vacation and the specific area to be vacated are Attachments 1 and 2 to this Report and Recommendation.
- 4. At the public hearing held on August 4, 2004, it became apparent that there was a significant discrepancy between the Road Services Division Staff Report and the underlying documentation with respect to the size of the vacation area. The staff report described the vacation area to be 425 square feet while the site maps depicted a total vacation area of 8,407.08 square feet. In order to determine the correct figure the hearing was continued and Road Services Division staff was requested to reevaluate its computation.
- 5. In a letter dated August 17, 2004 the County Road Engineer responded to the continuance notice and identified the error as a failure to recognize within the fee compensation calculation two of the three parcels containing proposed vacation area. Based on its revised assessment the Road Services Division now calculates the total vacation area to be 8,702 square feet and subject to a compensation fee of \$16,465.64. Because the Petitioner has previously paid \$1,419.00, the additional amount due for the vacation area is \$15,046.64.
- 6. As further noted in the August 17, 2004 letter, the Petitioner is simultaneously processing a binding site plan for the Glacier View Townhomes development which proposes to dedicate new public right-of-way in the amount of 43,266 square feet. Since this figure greatly exceeds the 8,702 square feet being vacated, the County Road Engineer has recommended that the new dedication be allowed to offset the compensation due the county and "that the \$1,419.00 previously paid be refunded to the petitioner after the ordinance vacating the subject area is passed by the King County Council". This recommendation has been incorporated into the

conditions attached to this report, subject to additional provisions that either require the

payment of the additional amount due or the expiration of the vacation approval if the binding site plan has not been recorded by the end of 2004. No comments or objections have been received from the Petitioner regarding the analysis contained in the County Road Engineer's August 17, 2004 letter.

CONCLUSIONS:

- 1. The road subject to this petition is useless as part of the King County road system, and the public will be benefited by its vacation.
- 2. The Notice of Hearing on the report of the Department of Transportation was given as required by law, and a hearing on the report was conducted by the King County Hearing Examiner on behalf of the King County Council.
- 3. A portion of the compensation required by law to be paid as a condition precedent to the vacation of this road has been deposited with King County, and the easements, if any, necessary for the construction, repair and maintenance of public utilities and services have been provided in a form satisfactory to the affected public utilities.
- 4. The conditions attached to this report require either payment of the remaining compensation or the dedication of offsetting right-of-way within the Glacier View binding site plan.
- 5. After the Glacier View binding site plan containing dedication of new public rights-of-way has been recorded, any compensation paid by the petitioner for the vacation area shall be refunded.

RECOMMENDATION:

APPROVE proposed Ordinance No. 2004-0259 to vacate the subject road, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Vacation of the right-of-way authorized by this ordinance shall not become effective until one of the following events has occurred:
 - a. A cashiers check for \$15,046.64 from the petitioner payable to the King County Treasury has been received as additional compensation for the vacated right-of-way; or
 - b. The Glacier View Binding Site Plan (DDES file nos. B02L1919 and B02DB003) has been filed for record containing a right-of-way dedication of 43,000 square feet, more or less.
- 2. Upon recording of the Glacier View Binding Site Plan referenced above, the petitioner shall be refunded any sums previously paid as compensation for the vacated right-of-way. This amount shall include the \$1,419.00 documented in exhibit no. 14 as receipt no. 59365 dated March 17, 2004.
- 3. If neither of the pre-effective contingencies stated in condition no. 1 have been satisfied by December 31, 2004, the approval conferred hereunder shall expire and the subject vacation shall become null and void.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL AND ADDITIONAL ACTION REQUIRED

In order to appeal the recommendation of the Examiner, written notice of appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council with a fee of \$250.00 (check payable to King County Office of Finance) on or before September 16, 2004. If a notice of appeal is filed, the original and 6 copies of a written appeal statement specifying the basis for the appeal and argument in support of the appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council on or before September 23, 2004.

Filing requires actual delivery to the Office of the Clerk of the Council, Room 1025, King County Courthouse, 516 3rd Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the date due. Prior mailing is not sufficient if actual receipt by the Clerk does not occur within the applicable time period. The Examiner does not have authority to extend the time period unless the Office of the Clerk is not open on the specified closing date, in which event delivery prior to the close of business on the next business day is sufficient to meet the filing requirement.

If a written notice of appeal and filing fee are not filed within 14 days calendar days of the date of this report, or if a written appeal statement and argument are not filed within 21 calendar days of the date of this report, the Clerk of the Council shall place a proposed ordinance which implements the Examiner's recommended action on the agenda of the next available Council meeting. At that meeting, the Council may adopt the Examiner's recommendation, may defer action, may refer the matter to a Council committee, or may remand to the Examiner for further hearing or further consideration.

Action of the Council Final. The action of the Council on a recommendation of the Examiner shall be final and conclusive unless within twenty-one (21) days from the date of the action an aggrieved party or person applies for a writ of certiorari from the Superior Court in and for the County of King, State of Washington, for the purpose of review of the action taken.

DEPARTMENT'S REPORT:

The Department of Transportation's written report to the King County Hearing Examiner for Item No. V-2472 was received by the Examiner on July 19, 2004.

PUBLIC HEARING:

After reviewing the Department of Transportation's Report and examining available information on file with the petition, the Examiner conducted a public hearing on the subject as follows:

V-2472—Glacier, LLC

The hearing on Item No. V-2472 was opened by the Examiner at 9:35 a.m., on August 4, 2004, in the Hearing Examiner's Conference Room, 400 Yesler Way, Seattle, WA 98104, and continued at 9:50 a.m. The hearing record closed on September 2, 2004. Participants at the public hearing and the exhibits offered and entered are listed in the attached minutes. A verbatim recording of the hearing is available in the office of the King County Hearing Examiner.

<u>FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATION</u>: Having reviewed the record in this matter, the Examiner now makes and enters the following:

FINDINGS:

1. General Information:

- 2. Except as provided below, the Examiner adopts and incorporates herein by this reference the facts set forth in the Department of Transportation's report to the King County Hearing Examiner for the August 4, 2004, public hearing and the statement of facts contained in Proposed Ordinance No. 2004-0259. The Department's report will be attached to those copies of this report and recommendation that are submitted to the Metropolitan King County Council.
- 3. Maps showing the vicinity of the proposed vacation and the specific area to be vacated are Attachments 1 and 2 to this Report and Recommendation.
- 4. At the public hearing held on August 4, 2004, it became apparent that there was a significant discrepancy between the Road Services Division Staff Report and the underlying documentation with respect to the size of the vacation area. The staff report described the vacation area to be 425 square feet while the site maps depicted a total vacation area of 8,407.08 square feet. In order to determine the correct figure the hearing was continued and Road Services Division staff was requested to reevaluate its computation.
- In a letter dated August 17, 2004 the County Road Engineer responded to the continuance notice and identified the error as a failure to recognize within the fee compensation calculation two of the three parcels containing proposed vacation area. Based on its revised assessment the Road Services Division now calculates the total vacation area to be 8,702 square feet and subject to a compensation fee of \$16,465.64. Because the Petitioner has previously paid \$1,419.00, the additional amount due for the vacation area is \$15,046.64.
- 6. As further noted in the August 17, 2004 letter, the Petitioner is simultaneously processing a binding site plan for the Glacier View Townhomes development which proposes to dedicate new public right-of-way in the amount of 43,266 square feet. Since this figure greatly exceeds the 8,702 square feet being vacated, the County Road Engineer has recommended that the new dedication be allowed to offset the compensation due the county and "that the \$1,419.00 previously paid be refunded to the petitioner after the ordinance vacating the subject area is passed by the King County Council". This recommendation has been incorporated into the

conditions attached to this report, subject to additional provisions that either require the

payment of the additional amount due or the expiration of the vacation approval if the binding site plan has not been recorded by the end of 2004. No comments or objections have been received from the Petitioner regarding the analysis contained in the County Road Engineer's August 17, 2004 letter.

CONCLUSIONS:

- 1. The road subject to this petition is useless as part of the King County road system, and the public will be benefited by its vacation.
- 2. The Notice of Hearing on the report of the Department of Transportation was given as required by law, and a hearing on the report was conducted by the King County Hearing Examiner on behalf of the King County Council.
- 3. A portion of the compensation required by law to be paid as a condition precedent to the vacation of this road has been deposited with King County, and the easements, if any, necessary for the construction, repair and maintenance of public utilities and services have been provided in a form satisfactory to the affected public utilities.
- 4. The conditions attached to this report require either payment of the remaining compensation or the dedication of offsetting right-of-way within the Glacier View binding site plan.
- 5. After the Glacier View binding site plan containing dedication of new public rights-of-way has been recorded, any compensation paid by the petitioner for the vacation area shall be refunded.

RECOMMENDATION:

APPROVE proposed Ordinance No. 2004-0259 to vacate the subject road, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Vacation of the right-of-way authorized by this ordinance shall not become effective until one of the following events has occurred:
 - a. A cashiers check for \$15,046.64 from the petitioner payable to the King County Treasury has been received as additional compensation for the vacated right-of-way; or
 - b. The Glacier View Binding Site Plan (DDES file nos. B02L1919 and B02DB003) has been filed for record containing a right-of-way dedication of 43,000 square feet, more or less.
- 2. Upon recording of the Glacier View Binding Site Plan referenced above, the petitioner shall be refunded any sums previously paid as compensation for the vacated right-of-way. This amount shall include the \$1,419.00 documented in exhibit no. 14 as receipt no. 59365 dated March 17, 2004.
- 3. If neither of the pre-effective contingencies stated in condition no. 1 have been satisfied by December 31, 2004, the approval conferred hereunder shall expire and the subject vacation shall become null and void.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL AND ADDITIONAL ACTION REQUIRED

In order to appeal the recommendation of the Examiner, written notice of appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council with a fee of \$250.00 (check payable to King County Office of Finance) on or before September 16, 2004. If a notice of appeal is filed, the original and 6 copies of a written appeal statement specifying the basis for the appeal and argument in support of the appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council on or before September 23, 2004.

Filing requires actual delivery to the Office of the Clerk of the Council, Room 1025, King County Courthouse, 516 3rd Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the date due. Prior mailing is not sufficient if actual receipt by the Clerk does not occur within the applicable time period. The Examiner does not have authority to extend the time period unless the Office of the Clerk is not open on the specified closing date, in which event delivery prior to the close of business on the next business day is sufficient to meet the filing requirement.

If a written notice of appeal and filing fee are not filed within 14 days calendar days of the date of this report, or if a written appeal statement and argument are not filed within 21 calendar days of the date of this report, the Clerk of the Council shall place a proposed ordinance which implements the Examiner's recommended action on the agenda of the next available Council meeting. At that meeting, the Council may adopt the Examiner's recommendation, may defer action, may refer the matter to a Council committee, or may remand to the Examiner for further hearing or further consideration.

Action of the Council Final. The action of the Council on a recommendation of the Examiner shall be final and conclusive unless within twenty-one (21) days from the date of the action an aggrieved party or person applies for a writ of certiorari from the Superior Court in and for the County of King, State of Washington, for the purpose of review of the action taken.
