7. Reports on Special and Outside Committees

Mr. Phillips reported on the Central Link Oversight Committee. At the February 9th committee meeting, the members focused on the expansion of the system, linking Bellevue, Overlake and Redmond. The committee had a report from Bellevue's Deputy Mayor Claudia Balducci regarding Bellevue's light rail best practices initiative. Mr. Phillips indicated the initial segment will open in July, 2009. Substantial progress has been made to the airport link; it is on schedule to open by the end of 2009.
