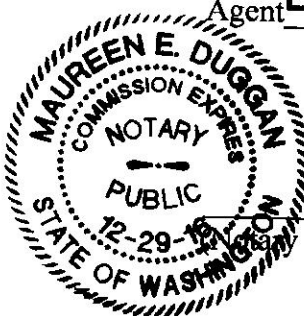

NOTICE OF Hearing
Proposed Ordinance 2014-0395**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Metropolitan King County Council held a public hearing in the Council Chambers on the 10th Floor of the King County Courthouse (516 Third Avenue, Seattle Washington) on Monday, the 10th day of November, 2014 at 11:00 a.m. The purpose of this public hearing was to consider adoption of Proposed Ordinance 2014-0395, adopting the capital facilities plans of the Auburn, Enumclaw, Federal Way, Fire, Highline, Issaquah, Kent, Lake Washington, Northshore, Renton, Riverview, Snoqualmie Valley and Tohoma School Districts for purposes of implementing the school impact fee program.

SUMMARY

The Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA) authorizes local jurisdictions to collect impact fees as a method of financing public facilities (i.e., roads, parks and open space, schools) that become necessary as a result of new growth and development.

King County administers the School Impact Fee Program by collecting fees from residential developers on behalf of each school district that chooses to participate (the program is voluntary). The fees are developed by the individual school districts in accordance with provisions in state law and the King County Code, and are set forth in the districts' capital facilities plans. The plans (and fees) are reviewed and adopted by the King County Council.

Proposed Ordinance 2014-0395 amends Title 20 to update the school capital facilities plans and implement the collection of impact fees by the county on behalf of the following school districts, effective January 1, 2015:
