Suggestions for MOA

The KCPOG and King County agree that the following matters are not mandatory subjects of bargaining so long as they are implemented as outlined in Motion 12892.

- A. The County may establish a citizen law enforcement oversight committee.
- B. The County may determine which branch of government it wants a civilian office of law enforcement oversight to report to.

The KCPOG and King County further agree on the following clarifications of the ratified and approved collective bargaining agreement.

- A. Article 22, Section x, Mediation Option. It is the mutual understanding of KCPOG and King County that Serious Matters are excluded from the mediation option.
- B. Article 22, Section y, Record Retention. While the OLEO may only retain records on a particular case for up to one year, the office shall have access to those same IIU case records at a later time if another incident occurs. (this is poorly worded but I am sure you can improve it)
