Ferguson, Hague, von Reichbauer, Lambert, Dunn and Irons 1 A MOTION expressing support for the Water Resource 2 Inventory Area 9 Chinook salmon habitat plan covering the 3 Green/Duwamish and Central Puget Sound watershed. 4 5 6 WHEREAS, both people and salmon depend on a healthy watershed, and 7 WHEREAS, Puget Sound Chinook salmon are an icon of the Pacific Northwest 8 and were listed as a threatened species under the Endangered Species Act ("ESA") in 9 1999 by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration ("NOAA"), and 10 WHEREAS, Puget Sound bull trout were listed as a threatened species under ESA in 1999 by the United States Fish and Wildlife Services ("USFWS"), and 11 12 WHEREAS, NOAA and USFWS can provide certain regulatory assurances to 13 jurisdictions that have committed to a recovery plan, and 14 WHEREAS, NOAA and USFWS are required to develop and implement plans 15 that address efforts to recover species listed under ESA, and

16	WHEREAS, the Water Resource Inventory Area ("WRIA") 9 Forum of Local
17	Governments, represented by sixteen jurisdictions, has devoted seven years to the
18	funding and development of a Chinook Salmon Habitat Plan for the Green/Duwamish
19	and Central Puget Sound Watershed, and
20	WHEREAS, the WRIA 9 salmon habitat plan has been developed by a steering
21	committee of multiple interests to guide actions over ten years to put Chinook salmon and
22	bull trout on the road to recovery, and
23	WHEREAS, extensive public involvement process and public review of the
24	WRIA 9 salmon habitat plan were undertaken, and
25	WHEREAS, the WRIA 9 salmon habitat plan is a science- and economic-based
26	plan that balances economic development with salmon habitat restoration needs, and
27	WHEREAS, the success of salmon recovery depends upon the cooperation of
28	federal, state, local agencies, tribes, nongovernmental organizations, private citizens and
29	other partners in allocating resources and implementing the WRIA 9 salmon habitat plan,
30	and
31	WHEREAS, King County supports regional cooperation at the WRIA level to set
32	common priorities for action among partners, efficient use of resources and investments
33	and distribution of responsibility for action and expenditures, and
34	WHEREAS, Shared Strategy for Puget Sound, a regional nongovernmental
35	organization, has assumed a lead role in developing a Puget Sound-wide, regional
36	salmon and bull trout recovery plan for submittal to NOAA Fisheries and USFWS;
37 .	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

38	A. The WRIA 9 Salmon Habitat Plan for the Green/Duwamish and Central Puget
39	Sound Watershed, Attachment A to this motion, is ratified. Ratification is intended to
40	express approval and support for the following:
41	1. The goals of the WRIA 9 Salmon Habitat Plan:
42	a. protect and restore physical, chemical and biological processes and the
43	freshwater, marine and estuarine habitats on which salmonids depend;
44	b. protect and restore habitat connectivity where feasible;
45	c. protect and improve water quality and quantity conditions to support healthy
46	salmonid populations; and
47	d. provide an implementation plan that supports salmon recovery;
48	2. Continued collaboration with other jurisdictions, state and federal agencies,
49	tribes and other stakeholders within the WRIA 9 area to implement the plan; and
50	3. Forwarding the plan to appropriate federal and state agencies through Shared
51	Strategy for Puget Sound, to be included in the Puget Sound Chinook salmon recovery
52	plan.
53	B. King County recognizes that negotiation of implementation commitments and
54	assurances with appropriate federal and state agencies will be an iterative process. Full
55	implementation of the plan is dependent on the following:
56	1. NOAA Fisheries will adopt the plan as an operative element of its ESA
57	Section 4(f) recovery plan for Puget Sound Chinook salmon;
58	2. NOAA Fisheries and USFWS will:
59	a. take no direct enforcement actions against King County under ESA for
60	implementation of actions recommended in or consistent with the plan;

61	b. endorse the plan and its actions and defend King County against legal
62	challenges by third parties; and
63	c. reduce the regulatory burden for King County activities recommended in or
64	consistent with the plan that require an ESA Section 7 consultation; and
65	3. Federal and state governments will:
66	a. provide funding and other monetary incentives to support plan actions and
67	monitoring activities;
68	b. streamline permitting for projects implemented primarily to restore
69	salmonid habitat or where the actions are mitigation that further plan implementation;
70	c. offer programmatic permitting for local jurisdiction actions that are
71	consistent with the plan;
72	d. accept the science that is the foundation of the plan and support the
73	monitoring and evaluation framework;
74	e. incorporate actions and guidance from the plan in future federal and state
75	transportation and infrastructure planning and improvement projects; and
76	f. direct mitigation resources toward plan priorities.

77 C. This motion does not obligate the King County council to future appropriations beyond current authority.
