



Top R&D Subjects in Washington (2003)






State and Local Tax Distribution (FY2005)



Travel Time Index (1993-2003)






Addressed Higher Education Problem: We produce too few degrees


Washington Leads the Nation in Using Bachelor's Degrees, But Is 36th in the Nation in the Production of Bachelor's Degrees




Washington's degree production is not concentrated in high demand fields

Higher Education Goals for our State

In order to meet the needs of our students and workforce, our state's colleges and universities need to produce:

- 36,625 total degrees by 2010 (8,000 over 2005 levels)
- 38,625 total degrees by 2020

PLUS

- Concentrate those degrees in high demand fields such as computer science, engineering, life sciences and secondary teachers in math, chemistry, physics, ESL and special education
- Add capacity in Community Colleges for accompanying two-year degrees.

✓ 2007 Goal: Fill existing capacity for degrees in high demand fields at Washington's higher education institutions.

Next Steps in Higher Education

- ✓ Fund current capacity in high demand, high impact fields.
- Study capital needs beyond current capacity.
- 3. Develop and implement a public awareness pilot project.
- 4. Provide more financial aid to encourage students to pursue degrees in high demand, high impact fields.
- 5. Fund FTEs at actual cost.
- 6. Adopt accountability standards and outcomes-based management of higher education.
- 7. Commit to a percentage of general fund budget for higher education investment.

Industry Cluster Employment by County



Tourism	49,024	2,820	8,730	7,982	68,556

- **Tourism**: Travel spending generates an estimated \$760 million in state and local tax revenues annually.
- Military: Sales by Puget Sound companies to local bases total \$350 million per year. In addition, businesses in the region contract with bases in other states and countries, as well as directly with the Pentagon.
