 Proposed Ordinance 2012-0405**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Metropolitan King County Council will hold a public hearing in the Council Chambers on the 10th Floor of the King County Courthouse (516 Third Avenue, Seattle Washington) on Monday, the 5th day of November, 2012 at 11:00 a.m. The purpose of this public hearing is to consider adoption of Proposed Ordinance 2012-0405, adopting the capital facilities plans of the Auburn, Enumclaw, Federal Way, Fife, Highline, Issaquah, Kent, Lake Washington, Northshore, Renton, Riverview, Snoqualmie Valley and Tahoma School Districts for purposes of implementing the school impact fee program.

SUMMARY

The Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA) authorizes local jurisdictions to collect impact fees as a method of financing public facilities (i.e., roads, parks and open space, schools) that become necessary as a result of new growth and development.

King County administers the School Impact Fee Program by collecting fees from residential developers on behalf of each school district that chooses to participate (the program is voluntary). The fees are developed by the individual school districts in accordance with provisions in state law and the King County Code, and are set forth in the districts' capital facilities plans. The plans (and fees) are reviewed and adopted by the King County Council.

Proposed Ordinance 2012-0405 amends Title 20 to update the school capital facilities plans and implement the collection of impact fees by the county on behalf of the following school districts, effective January 1, 2013:

The City of Shoreline Notice of Public Hearing of the Planning Commission Including SEPA DNS Threshold Determination

Description of Proposal: The proposed project action is the adoption of updates to the City of Shoreline Comprehensive Plan. The update is necessary to comply with the Growth Management Act (GMA). This is the required 2015 Update. Policies relating to commercial zone consolidation and controlling achievable densities through bulk standards were analyzed as part of this proposal.

On October 3, 2012 The City of Shoreline determined that the proposal will not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment and issued a DNS. The decision is issued in accordance with RCW 197-11-340(2). The City will not act on this proposal for at least 14 days from the date of issuance. This decision was made after review of the environmental checklist and other information on file with the City. A Notice of Adoption of existing environmental documents was issued September 28, 2012. The information is available to the public upon request at no charge.

This may be your only opportunity to submit written comments, including comments on the environmental impacts of the proposal. Written comments must be received at the address listed below before 5:00 p.m. October 18, 2012. Please mail, fax (206) 801-2788 or deliver comments to the City of Shoreline Attn: Miranda Redinger, 17500 Midvale Avenue North, Shoreline, WA 98133 or email to mirandare@shoreline.gov. Upon receipt, a copy of the final threshold determination for this proposal may be obtained together with the City Council.

Interested persons are encouraged to provide oral and/or written comments regarding the above proposal at an open record public hearing. The hearing is scheduled for Thursday, October 18, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 17500 Midvale Avenue N, Shoreline, WA. Copies of the proposal, SEPA Checklist and draft Comprehensive plan are available for review at the City Hall, 17500 Midvale Avenue North. There is no administrative appeal of this determination. The SEPA Threshold Determination may be appealed with the decision on the underlying action to superior court. If there is not a statutory time limit in filing a judicial review, the appeal must be filed within 21 calendar days following the issuance of the underlying decision in accordance with State law.
