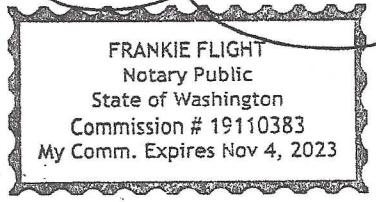

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held before the Metropolitan King County Council on the 27th day of April, 2021, at 1:00 p.m., to consider adoption of Proposed Ordinance 2020-0024, adopting amendments to King County Code 13.24.035 related to sewer service eligibility in the Vashon and Snoqualmie Pass rural towns. The public hearing is planned to either be held at the King County Courthouse, 516 3rd Avenue, Room 1001, Seattle, Washington; or the hearing may be required to be held remotely to comply with the Washington State Governor's Declaration 20-28 (or as amended) regarding the Open Public Meetings Act. Information on this public hearing, including how to submit public testimony and attend the meeting, will be posted on the Council's website ahead of the hearings.

SUMMARY

The Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA) tightly restricts provision of sewer service outside the Urban Growth Area boundary. While all of Vashon-Maury Island is located outside of the Urban Growth Area and is considered rural in nature, the King County Comprehensive Plan and King County Code recognize concentrations of higher density and economic activity in the Rural Area that existed prior to the adoption of the Growth Management Act by allowing rural towns, such as the Vashon Rural Town and the Snoqualmie Pass Rural Town, to have urban-style levels of density and development, including sewer.

Proposed Ordinance 2020-0024 amends Title 13 to clarify that expanding the area eligible for sewer service within the Vashon Rural Town requires a separate and distinct action from changing the Vashon Rural Town boundary, and that the Snoqualmie Pass Rural Town is also approved for sewer service. The legislation also clarifies that the Snoqualmie Pass Rural Town has also been approved for sewer service and must only provide sewer service to areas within the Rural Town boundary.

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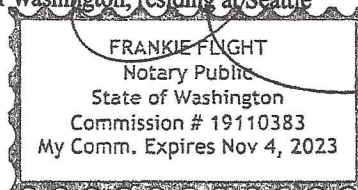

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a public hearing will be held before the Metropolitan King County Council on the 27th day of April, 2021, at 1:00 p.m. to consider adoption of Proposed Ordinance 2021-0057, an ordinance relating to the sale and use of fireworks in unincorporated King County. The public hearing is planned to be held remotely to comply with the Washington State Governor's Declaration 20-28 (or as amended) regarding the Open Public Meetings Act. It is expected that the full Council will take action on this Proposed Ordinance at the April 27th, 2021 meeting following the public hearing.

SUMMARY

King County is proposing this ordinance to:

- Prohibit the retail sale of, and use of, consumer fireworks in unincorporated King County.
- Continue to allow public displays of fireworks in unincorporated King County with a permit from the fire marshal, but limit public displays of fireworks to two per year on any given property.
- Remove detailed guidance on the application materials for a public display of fireworks, and give authority to the fire marshal to determine what should be in the application.
- Remove technical guidance and definitions in favor of citing state law and the international fire code.
- Request the executive to undertake a study and make a recommendation on how to provide unarmed, nonpolice enforcement of fireworks laws during the July fireworks season.
- Direct that civil and criminal penalties not be enforced for the discharge or use of consumer fireworks in the first year after the ordinance is effective.

Final Consideration:

In addition to the proposed amendments contained in the Proposed Ordinance, Councilmembers may offer additional amendments for consideration by the Council. As a result, persons interested in any of the issues raised in the Proposed Ordinances should make their views known at the public hearing on April 27, 2021. Amendments that may be considered for adoption by the Council on April 27, 2021 or thereafter include, but are not necessarily limited to:

- Making changes to civil and criminal penalties for violation of fireworks regulations.
- Limiting the fireworks prohibition to urban areas and Vashon-Maury Island, and continuing to allow fireworks sales and use in rural areas other than Vashon-Maury Island.
- Requiring that the ordinance not take effect until the executive has entered into a signed agreement with all cities and tribes in King County that allow fireworks sales, prohibiting them from selling fireworks to individuals that live in unincorporated King County.
- Allowing for the sale and use of certain types of consumer fireworks in unincorporated King County, with or without changes to the times these are allowed.
- Requiring a study relating to the enforcement of fireworks regulations.
- Any amendment contained in the Executive's proposed version of the subject legislation (Proposed Ordinance 2020-0169).
- Any amendment offered, or relating to topics discussed, during the review of the subject legislation in Council or committee.
- Any matter preserved for consideration by the Council by a member during previous Council or committee meetings.
