Workforce Progress Update


- 21 former employees have expressed interest in being rehired

Operator Workforce


Available Working Bus Operators (Full-Time Equivalent)





Mechanic Workforce



Fleet Availability


Fleet Availability

Ridership

- June average daily boardings – 238,719
- Year on year increase from June 2022 of 33,399 average weekday boardings
- Weekday ridership 58% of pre-COVID
- Weekend ridership 80% of pre-COVID





Sustainability Update

- King County Metro is receiving \$33.5 million in federal funding to support the purchase of zero-emission buses.
- Metro will use the funds to purchase 30 BEBs. Plan to convert 27 bus routes serving low-income communities and expanding our apprenticeship program.
