Dear Councilmember Zahilay:

This letter transmits a proposed Ordinance that would, if enacted, update King County's school impact fee regulations to reflect recent changes made to the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 82.02.060. These state law changes require an impact fee schedule reflect the proportionate impact of the new housing units based on a unit's square footage, number of bedrooms, or other factors. The proposed Ordinance would also change the timing of fee payment for housing associated with a new preliminary plat to the time a complete building permit application is filed. Finally, the proposed Ordinance would change the school capital facility/impact fee update from an annual to a biennial cycle.

RCW 82.02.050 authorizes counties that are required to plan under the State's Growth Management Act (RCW 36.70A.040) to collect impact fees to help fund school construction. Impact fees may be collected on new development to pay for public facilities needed to serve the resulting growth. King County Ordinance 11621 enables the collection of an impact fee on behalf of school districts serving residents living in unincorporated King County. Impact fees are currently assessed based on the housing unit type (e.g., single detached dwelling units and multiunit developments). The proposed Ordinance would update the method for calculating impact fees to instead be based on unit size, measured by the number of bedrooms within a unit, meeting the requirements of RCW 82.02.060.

In developing the proposed Ordinance, the Department of Local Services collaborated with a representative of several school districts for which King County collects impact fees. This was vital to ensure that the proposed fee calculation method would be feasible for school districts to implement while fulfilling the requirements of state law.
