1	AN ORDINANCE approving the Coal Creek Utility
2	District 2004 Comprehensive Plan for Water and Sewer
3	Systems.
4	
5	
6	PREAMBLE:
7	K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires approval of comprehensive plans for water
8	and sewer utilities as a prerequisite for granting right-of-way franchises
9	and approval of right-of-way construction permits.
10	The Coal Creek Utility District currently provides water and sewer service
11	to approximately nine thousand residents and over one thousand
12	employees in the cities of Newcastle and Renton and in unincorporated
13	areas.
14	The district obtains its water from the city of Seattle. The average annual
15	water demand is currently one million gallons per day. The average
16	annual demand is projected to increase to approximately one million three
17	hundred thousand gallons per day by 2023.

18	The district's sewer system discharges into King County's regional
19	collection system. Treatment is provided at King County's Renton
20	treatment plant.
21	Some areas within the district's sewer collection system experience high
22	flows due to infiltration and inflow. The district is proposing to reduce
23	flows from infiltration and inflow in its capital improvement program.
24	The district is proposing a six-year combined water and sewer capital
25	improvement program valued at over \$3,000,000.
26	The utilities technical review committee ("UTRC") reviewed the plan on
27	May 12, 2004. The UTRC was unable to determine from the data
28	provided by the district if the district's water conservation program or
29	water rate structure is effective in reducing water demand. The UTRC
30	conditionally approved the plan and recommended that additional
31	information concerning the district's conservation program and water rate
32	be obtained after council approval of the plan and prior to the district's
33	next scheduled water system plan. The technical conditions of UTRC
34	approval have been met in the plan attached to this ordinance.
35	The Coal Creek Utility District is reviewing its water conservation
36	program and is currently completing a water rate study.
37	A determination of nonsignificance for the plan was issued by the district
38	in accordance with the state Environmental Policy Act on July 8, 2004.
39	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

Water and Sewer Systems, Attachment A to this ordinance, is hereby conditionally
approved, conditioned upon the district providing the utilities technical review committee
("UTRC") with a copy of their water conservation program review and water rate study
upon completion, and prior to the district's next scheduled water system plan. The UTRC
shall inform the executive and council regarding its review of the district's water
conservation program review and water rate study.
