## **MDOP History and Evolution**


- Began in 1995
- MDOP attorneys on call 24/7, 365 days a year
- Respond to homicide scenes
- Assist detectives with search warrants, etc.
- Attend autopsies
- Vertical prosecution model
- Meet with victim families

### MDOP History and Evolution, cont.

- Staffing has changed over the years
- Began with 7 DPAs, 1 Chair, 2 paralegals, 1 victim advocate
- Mid 2000s: County Council funded Cold Case Unit
- Cold Case Unit lost funding in 2009
- 2020: increased to 9 DPAs when homicides began to increase
- 2022: increased to 14 DPAs, 5 paralegals, 4 victim advocates
- Current filed caseload per attorney = 14-25
- Loss of COVID funding threatens to impact MDOP staffing
- Currently 13 DPAs

### **Increased Complexity of Homicide Cases**

- Homicide cases are more labor intensive than 10 years ago
  - Body Worn Video
  - o In Car Video
  - Forensic Cell Phone Examinations
  - Cellular Phone Records
  - o Social Media Records
  - Advances in Forensic Sciences
  - Increased Mitigation Practice
  - Attorney Turnover (both KCPAO and DPD)

#### **MDOP 2023**

- Responded to 144 callouts (potential homicide scenes) in 2023 through 11/2/23
- In approximately 20 of those callouts, the victim survived or the cause of death was ruled an overdose, suicide, or accident
- 123 confirmed homicides to date




- Responded to 144 callouts (potential homicide scenes) in 2023 through 11/2/23
  - 2022 131 callouts (through 11/2)
  - 2021 117 callouts (through 11/2)
  - 2020 127 callouts (through 11/2)
  - 2019 79 callouts (through 11/2)
  - 2018 82 callouts (through 11/2)
  - 2017 71 callouts (through 11/2)
  - 2016 57 callouts (through 11/2)



#### Callouts to confirmed homicides:




# KC Medical Examiner data on Homicides in 2023 by circumstance of death:






### Recurring Homicide Trends (2023)

- 32 Public Residences (Encampments, RVs or vehicles, Motels, Public Housing, Shelters)
- 44 Non-Residential Public Places (parks, public parking lots, roadways, buses, trains, bus stops or light rail stations)



## **Shooting Victim Demographics**

Looking at confirmed King County gun violence in 2023

- 82% were people of color
- 20% were ages 18-24
- 52% were ages 25-49
- Shooting victims increased 46% over the 5-year average with homicides increasing 59% respectively
- This rise in gun violence is not unique to King County

#### **Cold Cases**

- No statute of limitations for homicide
- Law Enforcement continue to investigate homicide cases when caseloads allow
- Advances in forensic sciences lead to solving cold cases
  - Investigative Genetic Genealogy ("IGG")
- Resource heavy practice for Police and Prosecutors
  - Often reviewing thousands of pages of reports
  - Identify evidence to be tested
  - Locate witnesses
- Need funding for dedicated investigation/prosecution of cold cases
