1	AN ORDINANCE authorizing the vacation of a portion of
2	2nd Avenue South, File V-2484; Petitioners: Peter and
3	Gina Nunan.

6	STATEMENT OF FACTS:
7	1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 2nd
8	Avenue South hereinafter described.
9	2. The department of transportation notified the various utility companies
10	serving the area and has been advised that easements have either been
11	obtained or are not required within the vacation area.
12	3. The department of transportation records indicates that King County
13	has not been maintaining 2nd Avenue South. The records indicate that no
14	public funds have been expended for its acquisition.
15	4. The department of transportation considers the subject portion of the
16	right of way useless as part of the King County road system and believes

17	the public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax
18	rolls.
19	5. The right of way is classified as "C-Class" and, in accordance with
20	K.C.C. 14.40.020, the compensation due King County is based on fifty
21	percent of the assessed value of the subject right of way, which was
22	determined from records of the department of assessments. King County
23	is in receipt of \$24,182.50 from the petitioners.
24	Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was
25	held by the office of the hearing examiner on the 6th day of September
26	2006.
27	In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation the
28	council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King
29	County to grant said petition.
30	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
31	SECTION 1. The council, on the effective date of this ordinance, hereby vacates
32	and abandons that portion of 2nd Avenue South as conveyed to King County by the
33	recording of Assessor's Plat of Panorama Heights recorded in Volume 46 of Plats, Page
34	32, records of King County, Washington as described below:
35	That portion of the northwesterly thirty feet of 2nd Avenue South right of
36	way, adjacent and abutting the southeasterly line of Lot 116, Assessor's
37	Plat of Panorama Heights recorded in Volume 46 of Plats, Page 32,
38	records of King County, Washington.

39	SECTION 2. The vacation approved by this ordinance is subject to the following		
40	condition:		
41	That all future maintenance of the stormwater drainage features located		
42	within the vacation area shall be the responsibility of the petitioners Peter		
43	and Gina Nunan, their successors or assigns.

DEPARTMENT'S REPORTS:

The Department of Transportation's written reports to the King County Hearing Examiner for Item No. V-2484 were received by the Examiner on August 11, 2006 and December 21, 2006.

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PUBLIC HEARING:

In addition to reviewing the Department's Reports and examining available information on file with the petition, the Examiner conducted a public hearing on the subject as follows:

The hearing on Item No. V-2484 was opened by the Examiner on September 6, 2006, in the Hearing Examiner's Conference Room, 400 Yesler Way, Seattle, WA 98104, and continued administratively for receipt of an intended easement necessary for approval of the vacation. Due to unresolved disputation of the adequacy of the easement by a neighboring property owner (Robert Brothers), the hearing was reopened on January 24, 2007, again in the Hearing Examiner's Conference Room, to receive further testimony from the parties (the Nunans, Mr. Brothers and KCDOT) and to receive an updated recommendation from KCDOT. (No persons attended the January 24, 2007 hearing session except for the KCDOT representative.) The reopened hearing was then again continued administratively, the second time for receipt of a copy of a recorded revised easement, which was received January 30, 2007. Participants at the public hearing and the exhibits offered and entered are listed in the attached minutes. A verbatim recording of the hearing is available in the office of the Hearing Examiner.

<u>FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATION</u>: Having reviewed the record in this matter, the Examiner now makes and enters the following:

FINDINGS:

1. General Information:

- 2. The Notice of Hearing on the Department's report was given as required by law, and a hearing on the report was conducted by the Examiner on behalf of the Metropolitan King County Council.
- 3. Except as provided below, the Examiner adopts and incorporates herein by this reference the facts set forth in the Department's reports to the Examiner for the September 6, 2006 and January 24, 2007 public hearing sessions and the statement of facts contained in Proposed Ordinance No. 2006-0300. The Department's reports will be attached to those copies of this report and recommendation that are submitted to the County Council.
- 4. Maps showing the vicinity of the proposed vacation and the specific area to be vacated appear in the hearing record as exhibit nos. 7 and 9.
- 5. The subject right-of-way is currently unopened for public use and is not publicly maintained. It is used informally for access to adjacent property. (See next Finding.)
- 6. No easements are necessary to be retained for the construction, repair and maintenance of public utilities and services. An easement has been recorded which establishes a private access easement over the "current paved travel surface area" within the vacation area for adjacent property owners, with the easement supplemented by a five foot wide additional "unbuildable zone" abutting the northwest side of the paved area. The unbuildable zone was added to the

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originally proposed easement to provide additional clear area for large vehicle maneuvering by neighboring property owner Robert Brothers. KCDOT on direct inspection of the area has found the unbuildable zone width to provide adequate clear area. Mr. Brothers had disputed the adequacy of the proposed additional five-foot width to provide sufficient clear area. Though the hearing was reopened to allow testimony from him as well as other parties, he did not attend the reopened hearing (which was the subject of due notice) or communicate further with the Hearing Examiner's Office. His absence must be construed to mean that he has dropped his opposition.

- 7. Vacation of the right-of-way as proposed would have no adverse effect on the provision of access and fire and emergency services to the abutting subject property and surrounding area.
- 8. The right-of-way is not necessary for the present or future public road system for travel or utilities purposes.
- 9. The compensation required by law to be paid as a condition precedent to vacation of this road has been deposited with King County.

CONCLUSION:

1. The right-of-way segment subject to this petition is useless as part of the King County road system, and the public will be benefited by its vacation.

RECOMMENDATION:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL AND ADDITIONAL ACTION REQUIRED

In order to appeal the recommendation of the Examiner, written notice of appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council with a fee of \$250.00 (check payable to King County Office of Finance) on or before February 27, 2007. If a notice of appeal is filed, the original and six (6) copies of a written appeal statement specifying the basis for the appeal and argument in support of the appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council on or before March 6, 2007.

Filing requires actual delivery to the Office of the Clerk of the Council, Room 1025, King County Courthouse, 516 3rd Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the date due. Prior mailing is not sufficient if actual receipt by the Clerk does not occur within the applicable time period. The Examiner does not have authority to extend the time period unless the Office of the Clerk is not open on the specified closing date, in which event delivery prior to the close of business on the next business day is sufficient to meet the filing requirement.

If a written notice of appeal and filing fee are not filed within 14 days calendar days of the date of this report, or if a written appeal statement and argument are not filed within 21 calendar days of the date of this report, the Clerk of the Council shall place a proposed ordinance which implements the Examiner's recommended action on the agenda of the next available Council meeting. At that meeting, the Council may adopt the Examiner's recommendation, may defer action, may refer the matter to a Council committee, or may remand to the Examiner for further hearing or further consideration.

Action of the Council Final. The action of the Council on a recommendation of the Examiner shall be final and conclusive unless within twenty-one (21) days from the date of the action an aggrieved party or person applies for a writ of certiorari from the Superior Court in and for the County of King, State of Washington, for the purpose of review of the action taken.
