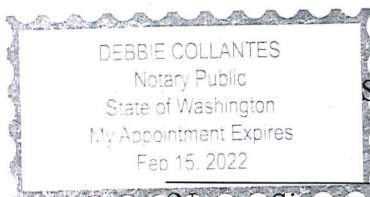

METROPOLITAN KING COUNTY COUNCIL NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING 2019-0416

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a public hearing will be held before the Metropolitan King County Council, Room 1001, King County Courthouse, Seattle, Washington, on the 4th day of December, 2019, at 9:30 a.m., to consider adoption of Proposed Ordinance 2019-0416, adopting the capital facilities plans of the Auburn, Enumclaw, Federal Way, Fife, Highline, Issaquah, Kent, Northshore, Lake Washington, Renton, Riverview, Snoqualmie Valley and Tahoma School Districts for purposes of implementing the school impact fee program.

SUMMARY

The Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA) authorizes local jurisdictions to collect impact fees as a method of financing public facilities (i.e., roads, parks and open space, schools) that become necessary as a result of new growth and development.

King County administers the School Impact Fee Program by collecting fees from residential developers on behalf of each school district that chooses to participate (the program is voluntary). The fees are developed by the individual school districts in accordance with provisions in state law and the King County Code, and are set forth in the districts' capital facilities plans. The plans (and fees) are reviewed and adopted by the King County Council.

Proposed Ordinance 2019-0416 amends Title 20 to update the school capital facilities plans and Title 27 to implement the collection of impact fees by the county on behalf of the following school districts, effective January 1, 2020:
