1	AN ORDINANCE approving the Skyway Water & Sewer
2	District 2004 Comprehensive Water and Sewer Plan
3	subject to specified conditions.

5	
6	PREAMBLE:
7	K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires approval of comprehensive plans for water
8	and sewer utilities as a prerequisite for granting right-of-way franchises
9	and approval of right-of-way construction permits.
10	RCW 43.20.260 requires that water system plans for any new industrial,
11	commercial, or residential use are to be consistent with the requirements
12	of any comprehensive plans or development regulations adopted under
13	chapter 36.70A RCW or any other applicable comprehensive plan, land
14	use plan, or development regulation adopted by a city, town or county for
15	the service area.
16	The Skyway water and sewer district ("district") currently provides water
17	service to approximately ten thousand residents, several schools and

	businesses and sewer service to approximately twelve thousand residents.
	The district is located in the south central portion of King County.
	The district obtains its water from the Cascade Water Alliance.
	("Cascade"), which has as its source the Seattle Public Utilities. The
	average annual water demand is currently approximately 0.7 million
	gallons per day. The demand is projected to increase to about 1.0 million
	gallons per day in 2022, or assuming a modest water conservation
	program, the demand is forecast to be 0.8 million gallons per day in 2022.
	The district is planning a water system capital improvement program
	valued at approximately \$15,000,000 over the long-term planning period.
	The capital improvements proposed include modifications to the storage
•	and distribution systems. The district also is planning sewer system
	capital improvements of approximately \$31 million for the long-term
	planning period.
	The King County utilities technical review committee ("UTRC") reviewed
	the plan on October 13, 2004, and requested that the district make changes
	to address comments from its consultant, and from the state Department of
	Health, particularly with regard to the ability of Cascade to account for
	twenty-year demand and supply. The UTRC also requested a statement in
	the plan regarding the district's commitment to evaluate its rates with
	regard to promoting water conservation, and making appropriate changes.
	The requested changes have been made, and the UTRC has forwarded the

40	revised plan for approval. The UTRC recommends that the King County
41	council approve the plan.
12	The Cascade Water Alliance has submitted to King County its
13	Transmission and Supply Plan ("TSP"), a comprehensive water system
14	plan, for approval by the King County council. The TSP addresses
1 5	transmission and supply of water for delivery to the Cascade members, of
1 6	which the Skyway water and sewer district is a member. Conditions may
1 7	be attached to the approval of the TSP that may apply to the individual
18	members of Cascade. Approval of the district's plan should be subject to
19	any such conditions that may apply to the individual members of Cascade
50	and to their comprehensive plans.
51	A determination of nonsignificance for the plan was issued by the district
52	on September 15, 2004, in accordance with the state Environmental Policy
53	Act.
54	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

55 SECTION 1.
