Proposed No. 2021-0404.1 **Sponsors** Balducci 1 A MOTION relating to the organization of the council; 2 amending Motion 11122, Section D, as amended, and OR 3 2-020, Motion 11122, Section G, as amended, and OR 2-4 040 and Motion 11122, Section H, as amended, and OR 2-5 050. 6 WHEREAS, in accordance with Sections 220.30 and 240 of the King County 7 Charter, the council organizes the legislative branch by motion, and 8 WHEREAS, in furtherance of that authority, the council passes organizational 9 motions that establish the council's committee structure, membership and chairs and vice-10 chairs to reflect the will of the council and to ensure the efficient conduct of council 11 business, and 12 WHEREAS, recent actions by councilmember Kathy Lambert in the 13 councilmember's campaign for reelection have adversely impacted the ability of the 14 council to conduct its business efficiently and effectively, and 15 WHEREAS, those actions, which are contrary to the county's equity and social 16 justice policies as set forth in Ordinance 16948, impede the councilmember's ability to 17 serve in council leadership roles because they: (a) have impaired the ability of 18 councilmembers and council staff to perform their duties; and (b) should not be deemed 19 to represent the council in its engagement with other governments, associations and the 20 public, and

21	WHEREAS, changes to the council's committee leadership structure are		
22	necessary to address the negative impacts;		
23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:		
24	I. Motion 11122, Section D, as amended, and OR 2-020 are hereby amended to		
25	read as follows:		
26	Standing committees - functions. In addition to any committee otherwise		
27	established by law, the committees of the metropolitan King County council and their		
28	respective functions are established as follows:		
29	A. Budget and fiscal management committee shall consider and make		
30	recommendations on: the county revenue and expenditure fiscal structural gap; capital		
31	and operating budget appropriations; the sale and lease of real property to or by the		
32	county; debt and investment proposals; bond issues; the office of economic and financial		
33	analysis; levies unless referred to another committee; supplemental appropriations related		
34	to the COVID-19 pandemic response; and financial policies.		
35	1. The committee shall develop recommendations on policy direction for the		
36	biennial budget, based on the recommendations of other council committees and taking		
37	into account the estimated fiscal impacts of state and federal legislation.		
38	2. In respect to consideration of the county's proposed biennial budget, all		
39	members of the council not assigned to the budget and fiscal management committee		
40	shall be considered ex officio voting members of the committee.		
41	B. Committee of the whole. The committee of the whole shall consider: issues		
42	of interest to the entire council, including appointments to the state legislature and		
43	department directors and key subordinate units in the executive branch; the annual		

legislative program; legislation before the federal, state and local governments that affect		
King County; the King County Strategic Plan; oversight of Harborview Medical Center;		
solid waste including waste to energy; arts and culture and associated levies, if any; the		
Puget Sound Taxpayer Accountability Account; gun safety; the immigrant and refugee		
commission; issues related to the census; the charter review commission; homelessness,		
including the King County Regional Homelessness Authority; the Best Starts for Kids		
levy implementation plan; COVID-19 pandemic response, excluding supplemental		
appropriations; and other program and policy matters. The committee of the whole shall		
conduct town hall meetings on issues of significance.		
C. ((Community, health and housing services committee.		
1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating		
to:		
a. health and housing services provided to the community by county agencies		
and branches, including, but not limited to, domestic violence facilitators, court		
navigators and community courts,		
b. public health programs, including those related to the protection, promotion

public health centers;		
c. affordable housing, including therapeutic and low-income housing;		
d. human services programs, including review of human services-related		
levies; and		
e. economic development including equity and pay disparity.
