Dear Councilmember Balducci:

In accordance with Ordinance 17485, this letter transmits a progress report on the rulemaking process for designating channel migration zones in King County to reduce flood risks.

Channel migration, a type of flood hazard from riverbank erosion and channel shifting, can threaten people and property. King County regulates land uses within mapped channel migration hazard areas to reduce these risks. The enclosed report includes a summary of work accomplished since June 2022 and lists upcoming milestones for the first and second quarters of 2023. The report addresses channel migration mapping and states that the Issaquah Creek study is underway, and the Lower Snoqualmie River draft report and mapping have been delayed due to staff vacancies.

Channel migration hazard areas are a type of Critical Area regulated by King County. The report and its associated hazard mapping are used by the Permitting Division of the Department of Local Services to review land-use and development proposals. The Department of Natural Resources and Parks uses the report and mapping to propose flood risk reduction actions to the County and the King County Flood Control District.

It is estimated that the report required two staff hours to produce, costing approximately \$200.

Thank you for your consideration of this report. The actions outlined in this report help King County residents stay informed about channel migration hazards that may place their homes and lives at risk and help direct future land development to safer locations.


