1 **STRIKING AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED RESOLUTION FCD2026-09,**

2 **VERSION 1**

3 On page 1, beginning on line 6, strike everything through page 5, line 83, and insert:

4 "WHEREAS, the King County Flood Control Zone District's ("the District")

5 comprehensive plan prioritizes expanded partnerships and collaborations with watershed

6 forums, and

7 WHEREAS, the District's comprehensive plan emphasizes the consideration of
8 fish and wildlife habitat when managing flood-risk, and

9 WHEREAS, the District seeks to protect public safety and promote the recovery
10 of native salmon species, and

11 WHEREAS, the District desires to continue funding watershed resource inventory
12 area ("WRIA") activities and projects that are identified using a process for awarding
13 WRIA grants in which the WRIA forums made grant recommendations to the District
14 and the King County water and land resources division administers the grant processes,
15 and

16 WHEREAS, in establishing the District's 2026 budget, the District provided
17 \$12,056,301 in funding for projects and activities in WRIAs 7 (Snoqualmie Watershed
18 portion), 8, 9 and 10 (King County portion), and

19 WHEREAS, the District amended its 2026 work program, budget, operating
20 budget, capital budget, and six-year capital improvement program in Resolution
21 FCD2026-08, and

22 WHEREAS, the annual carry-forward budget resolution is necessary to provide
23 budget authority for unspent appropriations from the prior year and to reinstate contract
24 encumbrances, and

25 WHEREAS, the carry-forward amount for unspent appropriations from 2025 to
26 2026 is \$268,532,773, and

27 WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 86.15.140, the District held a public hearing on the
28 proposed carry-forward amount and a supplemental budget on July 14, 2026, and

29 WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 86.15.110, the board of supervisors ("the Board")
30 has determined that the flood control improvements adopted by this resolution generally
31 contribute to the objectives of the District's comprehensive plan of development, and

32 WHEREAS, the Board desires to adopt amendments to the District's 2026 budget,
33 operating budget, capital budget, and six-year capital improvement program;

34 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF
35 SUPERVISORS OF THE KING COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL ZONE DISTRICT:

36 SECTION 1. The Board adopts a revised 2026 budget for the District, as set forth
37 in Attachment B to this resolution, titled "2026 Reallocation Budget July 6, 2026," and
38 amends FCD2026-08, Section 1, accordingly.

39 SECTION 2. The Board adopts a revised 2026 operating budget for the District,
40 as set forth in Attachment C to this resolution, titled "2026 Reallocated Operating Budget
41 July 6, 2026," and amends FCD2026-08, Section 1, accordingly.

42 SECTION 3. The Board adopts a revised 2026 capital budget for the District,
43 consisting of the projects and expenditures as set forth in Attachment D to this resolution,
44 titled "2026 Reallocated Capital Budget July 6, 2026," and amends FCD2026-08, Section
45 1, accordingly.

46 SECTION 4. The Board adopts a revised six-year capital improvement program
47 for the District, as set forth in Attachment E to this resolution, titled "2026-2031
48 Reallocated Six-Year CIP July 6, 2026," and amends FCD2026-08, Section 1,
49 accordingly.

50 SECTION 5. The Board adopts a revised 2026-2031 capital budget project list, as
51 set forth in Attachment H to this resolution, titled "2026-2031 Six-Year CIP Project
52 Allocations + Carryover July 6, 2026" and amends FCD2026-08, Section 1, accordingly.

53 SECTION 6. A. The Board authorizes the funding of water quality and water
54 resources and habitat restoration projects and activities as follows:

- 55 1. WRIA 7 (Snoqualmie Watershed portion) - \$2,399,991;
- 56 2. WRIA 8 - \$4,521,113;
- 57 3. WRIA 9 - \$4,658,862; and
- 58 4. WRIA 10 (King County portion) - \$602,899.

59 B. The amounts listed in subsection A. of this section are in accordance with the
60 projects, grant recipients and individual grant amounts described in Attachment J to this
61 resolution, titled "2026 Cooperative Watershed Management Grants."

62 SECTION 7. A. The Board authorizes the extension, enlargement, acquisition,
63 or construction of improvements, as applicable, as set forth on Attachments B, C, D, E,
64 and H of this resolution.

65 B. The 2006 King County Flood Hazard Management Plan ("Flood Plan"), as
66 amended, serves as the comprehensive plan of development for flood control and
67 floodplain management, and has been prepared for the streams or watercourses upon
68 which the improvements will be enlarged, extended, acquired or constructed. The
69 improvements authorized herein generally contribute to the objectives of the Flood Plan.

70 C. For improvements that are to be constructed, preliminary engineering studies
71 and plans have been made, consisting of one or more of the following: the 2006 Flood
72 Plan, as amended, preliminary feasibility analyses, conceptual designs and design
73 manuals, and such plans and studies are on file with the county engineer.

74 D. Estimated costs for acquisitions and improvements together with supporting
75 data are set forth on Attachments B, C, D, E, and H to this resolution.

76 E. The improvements set forth in Attachments B, C, D, E, and H to this
77 resolution are determined to benefit the county as a whole, as well as the zone.
