1 AN ORDINANCE increasing the size of the King County
2 commission on governance; and amending Ordinance
3 14514, Section 3.

6 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

7 SECTION 1. Ordinance 14514, Section 3, is hereby amended to read as follows:

8 A. The commission shall consist of ~~((nine))~~ eleven voting members. The
9 members shall be appointed by the executive from nominations submitted by a selection
10 committee consisting solely of the county executive, the chair of the council, the
11 prosecuting attorney and the presiding judge of the superior court. The selection
12 committee shall reach consensus on all nominations to the commission. The
13 appointments shall be subject to confirmation by the council.

14 B. When making nominations to the commission, the selection committee shall
15 appoint at least one member from academia and higher education, one member from
16 organized labor ~~((and))~~, one member from business and industry and two members who
17 reside in unincorporated King County.

18 C. When making the remaining nominations to the commission, the selection
19 committee should consider candidates representing the following categories of
20 professional experience: accounting and finance; law, criminal justice and law
21 enforcement; academia and higher education; municipal government; public
22 transportation; roads and freight mobility; organized labor; the clergy; business and
23 industry; real estate and land use; social and human services; and environmental
24 conservation. The selection committee should also consider candidates representing
25 different geographic areas within the county, racial and ethnic backgrounds and gender.

26 D. All appointees should have:

27 1. Either or both a working knowledge of local government operations and
28 financing, or significant experience in one or more of the professional categories listed in
29 subsections B and C of this section;

30 2. A strong commitment to responsible, effective and efficient government in
31 King County;

32 3. An ability to work with differing viewpoints to find solutions to complex
33 problems; and

34 4. A willingness to commit the time necessary to attend commission meetings
35 and activities.

36 E. No appointee shall hold or be a candidate for elected office while serving on
37 the commission.

38 F. The selection committee shall submit all nominations to the executive and the
39 executive shall transmit to the council the appointments to the commission, including

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40 names and contact information of the ((~~nine~~) eleven commission members((~~by~~
41 ~~December 6, 2002~~)).


