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MS. PETERSON: I'm going to bring the hearing to order. We will now be opening the hearing. I just want to thank you all for coming out tonight. I'm Erika Peterson with King County, and I'm the facilitator tonight. This is Pam Elardo, who's also with King County and is going to give us some information about the property transfer, which is the issue tonight.

I'll just go over the rules of this meeting. If you decide to come and speak, we have a signup sheet here and we'll call people in the order that they're signed up. Clearly state your name and address so the court reporter has the information for the record, and please keep your comments relatively short. Typically we give a three-minute time limit -- if we don't have a lot of people ready to speak. We'll let you know when your three minutes is up and maybe that will be a good time to finish up.

The listening panel, which is Pam, won't be responding to comments during the public comment period. This is a formal time to hear from you. We can answer questions after the hearing closes. And you don't have to make a formal comment if you're uncomfortable doing this in front of a

group. We do have a written comment form, so you're welcome to do that; but leave it with us tonight because the record from this meeting is going immediately to the King County Council tomorrow because they are going to be making a decision about this on Monday.

So that's basically the rules. Any questions about what we're up to today? We actually -- Debra has these red, yellow, green cards, so when she puts up the red card, that will be your signal that your three minutes is up.

Okay. That took us to 6:00. Pam, you're on.

MS. ENOLA: Great. Again, thank you for coming to this public hearing. And I wanted to explain a little about the purpose of the hearing itself because we're pretty narrowly focused on the property transfer from King County to Washington State Department of Transportation and Snohomish County Public Utility District.

Washington State Department of
Transportation Department transfer is under
ordinance No. 2005-0321, and that specifically is
for the transfer of property to WSDOT for the

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Route 9 widening project. So we've been working closely with WSDOT over the last several months to document what pieces of property will go to them and the purpose of it to complete their larger Route 9 property.

The second ordinance is 2005-0342, which is for the transfer of property to easement rights to Snohomish County Public Utility District, specifically to serve the Brightwater Project. You noticed the utility poles out front as well as to serve some other customers in the local region.

The reason why we're having this hearing is, typically when we transfer property from King County to another entity, that happens in King County. But the state law for Washington State requires that if you are transferring property, the county in which the property is being transferred is the place where the hearing needs to occur. So in this case, even though we're King County, we're transferring the property outside of King County, so we needed to have this hearing here in Snohomish County. Typically it happens in the King County Council as part of the transfer process.

And like Erika said, this record will actually go to the King County Council and then it will become part of the final action that they'll be voting on next week.

Okay. I guess the other final comment, I'll just say that all property that's transferred from King County needs to go through this process, so typically parks or any other parcels that need to be transferred go through this process. In this case it's approximately an acre in total size of our 140-acre site.

So I would like to open up to the public hearing process right now and see if anybody signed up and would like to make a comment. And then if anybody still wants to make a comment after that, we can do that. So I think there is one person signed up.

MS. PETERSON: So we have Greg Stephens signed up to speak.

GREG STEPHENS

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Well, I guess somebody has to be first. My name is Greg Stephens, and for the record I live at 21926 State Route 9 Southeast, Woodinville --

Maltby -- Washington 98072. And we'll get that zip code changed as soon as we incorporate Maltby.

I come before you tonight as a local property owner like many of you that I recognize here in the audience. This is the near culmination of a long process that we've all been involved in, in my case over five years now, I think, and counting. And I expect to be involved in this for some time, until we get all of the things that I think this facility can bring to our community.

Long ago when I saw that it appeared to me to be the place that it was going to go, I decided to get involved with the process in order to help make sure that our community got what we needed out of that process and having seen other wastewater treatment plants in the western part of the United States from San Diego, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Portland, to here -- and Vancouver.

I decided that some of the amenities that can go with the mitigation package for a large regional public facility would be to our benefit in our neighborhood that we could not get from

Snohomish County probably in my lifetime, given the tax rates that we already bare and the fact that the county is nearly broke most of the time.

I think this facility can give us mitigation that will buy us parks for our community. It will buy us open space. I think it will buy us some habitat for salmon so that they can continue in our neighborhood long after I'm gone. And I think that's something that we need to leave for our children and our grandchildren. These are trite sayings to some people but they aren't to me. It's what I live for.

I've become a candidate for the Snohomish

County Council because of this process, and I

intend to fight for our community to get our just

amount of parks and mitigation dollars for the

Maltby community. That's why I'm here tonight,

that's why I will be here long after tonight.

And I invite the rest of the neighbors to join

with me, now that this process is near

completion, to get what our community needs to

have to go forward in the future and unite

together for that future and put aside a lot of

the things that have gone on before now.

It's time to pull together, I think, in the

rest of the country and here as well. It's time to unite. Thank you, very much.

MS. ELARDO: I don't think we have other people signed up.

MS. PETERSON: There's nobody else signed Would anybody like to speak or like an opportunity to speak? Okay.

What we'll do is close the hearing for now. We'll have a chance to ask questions and answer them. And then if anybody should decide they want to speak before 6:30, we'll reopen the hearing. So the hearing is now closed.

[Pause in proceedings.]

MS. PETERSON: Okay. We are going to reopen the hearing just very briefly so that we can formally close it on time. So it is 6:27, and I'm reopening the hearing, and I'd like to invite anybody who'd like to to sign up to speak if you would like. Seeing no hands, I will formally close the hearing. Thank you, very much, for coming tonight.
