Dear Councilmember Upthegrove:

As called for by Motion 14449, this letter transmits the 2024 work plan and budget for the King County-Cities Climate Collaboration (K4C), and a proposed Motion that would, if enacted, accept receipt of the report.

The K4C is a voluntary, formal partnership between King County, the Port of Seattle, and 21 King County cities that together represent more than 85 percent of King County's more than 2.3 million residents. The enclosed report outlines the K4C's work plan, budget, and next actions.

The K4C 2024 work plan details work by partners to help launch a regional building decarbonization campaign and information platform. This work will support K4C communities by centralizing information through a high-quality outreach platform and serving as a model for a navigator program that could serve additional communities in the region or across the state. The 2024 work plan also has a climate policy focus based on K4C's shared State Policy and Legislative Interests for 2024.

King County's 2020 Strategic Climate Action Plan (SCAP) outlines effective strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and prepare for the impacts of a changing climate, which will require an integrated countywide effort involving public, private, and non-governmental partnerships. Motion 14449, which requests this annual report, outlined that King County will continue to play a key role in the K4C, which has collaborated to develop a shared countywide vision and priority actions for confronting climate change. All included priorities and investments were co-developed by King County and members of the K4C.

The K4C work plan and budget support collective work representing King County and the K4C's partners. The report was informed by a working group and K4C members.
