D. Swift approval of this ordinance is necessary to ensure that the local voters pamphlet can be completed in a timely way. For this reason, the county desires this ordinance to take effect by September 17.

SECTION 2. The director of the records, elections and licensing services division is hereby authorized and requested to prepare and distribute a local voters pamphlet, pursuant to K.C.C. 1.10.010, for the special election called for in Ordinance 14994, the cost of the pamphlet to be included as part of the cost of the special election.

SECTION 3. Pursuant to RCW 29A.32.280, the following individuals are appointed to serve on the voters pamphlet committees, each committee to write a statement for or against the advisory ballot question:
