1 A MOTION adopting the 2006 Facility Master Plan Update 2 for the Bow Lake Transfer/Recycling Station. 3 4 WHEREAS, the Bow Lake transfer/recycling station operates twenty-four 5 hours a day on weekdays and handles approximately one third of the system's total 6 tonnage, playing a major role in the county's solid waste system, and 7 WHEREAS, a new station and facility improvements will greatly improve the 8 efficiency of the station's solid waste and recyclable materials processing capability, and 9 WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan, RTS 3, directs 10 the county to focus capital investment to: 11 A. Maintain the county's solid waste transfer system facilities in a safe condition 12 for both the system's customers and employees; 13 B. Upgrade its transfer system to serve a future waste export system when the Cedar Hills regional landfill reaches its permitted capacity, or at such earlier time as the 14 15 county may decide; 16 C. Improve transfer stations to improve efficiency, capacity and customer 17 service; and

18	D. Expand, relocate or replace or any combination thereof, transfer stations when
19	safety, efficiency, capacity or customer services needs cannot be met by existing transfer
20	facilities, and
21	WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan, RTS 12,
22	designates the Bow Lake transfer/recycling station as capable of being expanded on its
23	current site in order to provide a full range of solid waste disposal and recycling services
24	for county residents and businesses, and
25	WHEREAS, the development of the Bow Lake Facility Master Plan included a
26	public notification and involvement process, which involves meetings with the host
27	cities; letters to cities in the service area, as well as to the West Hill and North Highline
28	Unincorporated Area Councils, local community groups, neighboring property owners,
29	and commercial haulers; a public meeting; distribution of project information to
30	customers at the facility; and development of a project website, and
31	WHEREAS, the solid waste division worked collaboratively with the King
32	County solid waste advisory committee and the metropolitan solid waste management
33	advisory committee to develop the Transfer and Waste Export System Plan, which is
34	consistent with the Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan, and
35	WHEREAS, environmental review has been completed on the Bow Lake Facility
36	Master Plan under the state Environmental Policy Act and a mitigated determination of
37	nonsignificance has been issued, and
38	WHEREAS, K.C.C. 4.04.210 requires the King County council to review, amend
39	defer or adopt operational master plans, facility master plans, facility program plans,
40	capital improvement program ("CIP") project cost elements, schedules and total budget in

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- the annual CIP budget or amendments thereto pursuant to the provisions of the King
- 42 County charter;
