7	1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of that portion of NE
8	132nd Street hereinafter described.
9	2. The department of transportation notified the various utility companie
10	serving the area and has been advised that easements were not required
11	within the vacation area.
12	3. The department of transportation records indicates that King County
13	has not been maintaining NE 132nd Street. The records indicate that no
14	public funds have been expended for its acquisition.
15	4. The department of transportation considers the subject portion of the
16	right-of-way useless as part of the county road system and believes the

17	public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax
18	rolls.
19	5. In a separate private agreement Jan Norvold has agreed to quit claim
20	deed his interest in the NE 132nd Street right-of-way adjacent to his
21	property to Anthony and Lillian Bay.
22	6. The right-of-way is classified as "C-Class" and, in accordance with
23	K.C.C. 14.40.020, the compensation due King County is based on fifty
24	percent of the assessed value of the subject right-of-way which was
25	determined from records of the department of assessments. King County
26	is in receipt of \$18,900.37 for that portion of NE 132nd Street adjacent to
27	the Bays' property and \$8896.75 for that portion of NE 132nd Street
28.	adjacent to the Norvold property, both payments are from the Bays.
29	Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was
30	held by the office of the hearing examiner on the 18th day of July, 2003.
31	In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation,
32	the council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of
33	King County to grant said petition.
34	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

The Department of Transportation's written report to the King County Hearing Examiner for Item No. V-2451 was received by the Examiner on July 1, 2003.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL

In order to appeal the decision of the Examiner, written notice of appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council with a fee of \$250.00 (check payable to King County Office of Finance) on or before August 13, 2003. If a notice of appeal is filed, the original and six (6) copies of a written appeal statement specifying the basis for the appeal and argument in support of the appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the King County Council on or before August 20, 2003.

Filing requires actual delivery to the Office of the Clerk of the Council, Room 1025, King County Courthouse, 516 3rd Avenue, Seattle, Washington 98104, prior to the close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the date due. Prior mailing is not sufficient if actual receipt by the Clerk does not occur within the applicable time period. The Examiner does not have authority to extend the time period unless the Office of the Clerk is not open on the specified closing date, in which event delivery prior to the close of business on the next business day is sufficient to meet the filing requirement.
