Rapp quickly establishes himself in secondary

Taylor Rapp's pro debut ascension to stardom hasn't surprised the Huskies. The true freshman safety from Bellingham enrolled early and participated in spring drills. Coach Chris Petersen took notice of Rapp immediately.

"He broke his hand the second day, and I'm thinking, well, there goes his spring football," Petersen said. "Well, next day I didn't even know, he's out there with a big club on, not even thinking twice about it. That's him. He's been great."

On Tuesday, Rapp was named the Pac-12's freshman defensive player of the year, joining an illustrious UW fraternity that includes two of the program's most decorated players. He's the first UW defensive player to win the award and joins Reggie Williams (2001) and Jake Locker (2007) as the only Huskies to earn freshman of the year recognition.

Rapp has played in every game and started eight times for Washington, which routinely uses five defensive backs. He is fifth on the team with 42 tackles.

Co-defensive coordinator Jimmy Lake has raved about Rapp's sure-tackling abilities and said the newcomer took his game to another level when he collected two interceptions during a 26-13 loss to USC three weeks ago. Rapp's two picks are tied for the team lead.

"To separate yourself as a DB, you need to make the big momentum-swinging plays, and he did that," Lake said. "He's got that in him. We always talk about takeaways and turnovers. Getting the ball back."

"He can be one of those guys that you talk about for a long time."

Almost remarkably Rapp beat out more seasoned and veteran teammates to establish a significant role in a veteran secondary that includes All-Pac-12 first-team safety Sidney Jones and Budaka Baker, plus honorable mention selection Kevin King.

"This is a guy that I thought would be like Budaka coming down the line," King said. "Mentally, he's here. Just seeing him on the field and playing with him, I wouldn't know how old he was... Now he's put that freshman trust behind him and he's just another player back there. He's a part of our unit. He's fully engaged in it."

Washington's Ben Burrow-Kirven, Jake Erdrenkamp and Jeff Lindquist were named Wednesday as Pac-12's all-academic first team, three of the 16 players recognized for their academics by the conference.

Erdrenkamp, a senior from Medina, is the only three-time, first-team all-academic selection on the team this season. An offensive lineman who graduated cum laude with a finance degree from the Foster School of Business, he was also named Academic All-District 8 and was a first-team All-Pac-12 offensive lineman.

Lindquist is a two-time Pac-12 academic honoree, having earned a spot on the team last year. The former quarterback turned tight end from Mercer Island is also a Foster School grad who boasts a 3.50 grade-point average.

Burrow-Kirven, a sophomore from Menlo Park, Calif., is a linebacker and top special-teams performer who was also a member of the All-District 8 team this year. He

carries a 3.71 GPA as a pre-med and sciences major. Six Huskies were named to the second team: sophomore wide receiver Andrew Baccellia (3.42 GPA, pre-med and sciences), junior defensive lineman Greg Gaines (3.13,

pre-social sciences), sophomore defensive lineman Vha Ve'a (3.10, anthropology), sophomore linebacker Tevis Bartlett (3.58, pre-med and sciences), Baker (3.29, American ethnic studies) and junior defensive back Trevor

Walker (3.31, economics). Seven Huskies earned honorable mentions: quarterback Jake Browning, tight end Drew Sample, safety Hlayshah, corner Coleman Shelton and linebacker

Psalm Woohching. **NOTE**
*Named Tuesday the Pac-12's offensive player of the year, Browning on Wednesday was named one of five finalists for the Walter Camp Football Foundation 2016 Player of the Year award.

Browning is joined by Louisville QB Lamar Jackson, Clemson QB Deshaun Watson, Alabama QB Jonathan Allen and Michigan linebacker/return specialist Jabrille Peppers.
Also Wednesday, Browning was named one of 10 finalists for the Manning Award, to be given to the nation's top quarterbacks. Among the other finalists are Washington State's Luke Falk and USC's Sam Darnold.
